We would like to recognize a few people in our Sandy Pines family. If you are not aware, we have welcomed back Mary Applehof to our Sandy Pines staff. Mary was with us previously in the role of Recreation Director where she did an exceptional job leading many events that all of us enjoyed throughout the season. Mary left us to pursue, and later build, a successful real estate portfolio and business. We asked Mary to come back to restructure our Sales Department and team. She has brought new ideas, processes and recommendations that we believe our members and customers will appreciate, as it will take this department to the next level. We are also in the process of hiring a Human Resource assistant. This is a need identified early during our off season. We have interviewed many candidates and expect to have this position filled by year end. As we talk about staff changes, it is with a heavy heart that our family lost a dear loved one in November. Kelli Blackman, who many of you know and have seen as a staple to our Guest Services

and Camping Department, lost her battle with cancer. Please surround Kelli's family, friends, loved ones and our staff with prayers, as this was a hard, sudden loss. She is at home with her Creator, but will be missed by many here at Sandy Pines. Lastly, we would like to say Thank You to all who have served, or are currently serving, in our Military. We will never know the true level of service or sacrifice our military endures each and every day to protect us. We do, however, give thanks and prayers for their safe return, whether it is during this holiday season, or any time during the year. We support them, love them and appreciate them as they are the reason, with God's grace, we enjoy being safe in this country.

As in many organizations, Sandy Pines Operations does not have an off season, although many still think this may be the case. Each department has many projects that go on throughout the off season as we prep for your upcoming 2020 return.

We have met with Restorative Lake Sciences and PLM who treat our beautiful lake. You may remember at the last Board of Directors meeting in September, many were requesting an update and release of the information. Although the survey was completed, it lacked actions or recommendations to implement. We requested RLS and PLM to go back to provide those ac-

tions and recommendations. They have provided recommendations to help address the needs we, at Sandy Pines, have requested or identified. The plan is to provide an update to the Board in the near future. We can then communicate that information to the members.

The Pool Committee, in conjunction with our Marketing and Communications team, worked diligently to generate a survey specific to the members' thoughts regarding an additional pool(s). Thank you to all who provided survey responses, as we received a phenomenal response. Please see comments elsewhere in the Footprints specific to the survey findings, statistics and next steps.

Sandy Pines and Salem Township have finalized the sourcing of the new FEMA Storm Shelter to be located in Phase 4. Salem Township has been a very important partner on recent FEMA Grant projects. We appreciate all their guidance and support. If you visit the park during the off season, you will see preparations taking place to break ground for this project. This is an exciting time as we add this new structure to our community.

We continue to work on many things during the off season such as a cart bridge between Phase 3 and 6, Main Gate upgrades, IT and technology improvements, financing options for new members who want to buy, safety and rule reviews and planning for our upcoming 50th Anniversary. All of this is being done while regular park clean up, maintenance and member services are taking place. We have a great staff that is working hard to be ready for your return. If you have the opportunity to thank them in person, text or email, please do so. It will be greatly appreciated to hear "Thank you for all you do for us at Sandy Pines".

Finally, we held our first Strategic Planning event in November. We gathered all Operations Leaders in each department to review our plans for today, as well as the future. We kicked off our event with some Things to Think About. Things such as "The most dangerous phrase in

ANNUAL DUES

If you are making monthly payments, your account balance as of December 25th should be at or below \$962 to be on track with the payment plan. You can check your balance by logging into [Member Web Access/Online Billing](#) tab, or by calling Member Service. Your January quarterlies are due in excess of your dues/assessments payment. Remember: If you're using the payment plan, your account is past due, but the max balances are in place to keep you in good standing. A missed payment or balance overage will result in magnetic card deactivation with a reactivation rate of \$35 per card.

JANUARY QUARTERLY ELECTRIC & STATE TAX

Quarterly Electric and State Tax are billed in January, April, July and October. Electric

meters are read once per year in August. Your bill is based on total kilowatt hours used. You pay for your adjusted final electric use in October, then your total use is divided by four and you pay those quarterly amounts in January, April and July. This is why you get an electric bill in January even though you may not be in the park during that time. You can view and print your annual electric use by logging into [Member Web Access](#). State Tax is billed as \$9.50 per quarter per site.

ANNUAL RENEWALS

We'll be sending renewal notices after the first of the year. If you have an email address on file, your notice will be sent electronically, otherwise, your notice will be sent via mail. If you have not received your renewal notice by February 1st, please call Member Service. **Please note: Your renewal notice is not a bill.** You have until March 13th to update, add or remove renewal services before they are billed on your April statement. Renewals include membership cards, annual stickers, internet service if applicable, pump out plans, boat docks, boat in & out service, annual bullpen storage and mailboxes. The notices will include instructions. Please review your renewals carefully and make sure the information is accurate. If you don't need any changes, you do not have to return your renewal form. Send the form back only if you make changes and we'll confirm your updates. Credit will not be issued for membership cards not removed from the account by March 16th.

MEMBER WEB ACCESS

If, for any reason you don't receive or if you lose track of your renewal information, you can access it 24 hours a day by logging into your [Member Web Access Portal](#). There you have the ability to: review your annual renewal information (stickers, services & member cards), schedule guest passes, schedule pump outs, review pump out

Member Web Access: This is your online portal for checking account balances, making payments, ordering guest passes, and soon will host your annual renewal information.

• **Handbook (Rules & Bylaws):** If you haven't reviewed the year end updates to the Sandy Pines Handbook, now is a great time to do so. The 2019 Handbook Rulebook Revisions article posted on 10/17 in the Park News outlines all the recent updates.

• **Registered Contractors List:** The Park Inspector will be in the park Tuesdays during the off-season. The inspector provides regular updates to the Registered Contractors List. These contractors may be able to help you with leaf cleanup, snow removal, and anything else you may need while away in the off season.

• **Annual Dues:** The link to Annual Dues information provides the monthly minimum balances needed to remain on track with the payment program.

• **Surveys:** We have created a surveys page at SandyPines.com/Surveys to get your feedback on a variety of issues. You will always find our staff survey on this page so you can provide feedback anytime you want to share experiences with our staff. Thanks to all who provided feedback in our recent Pool Survey, as response rates were through the roof! You'll find a summary of that survey provided in this edition of the Footprints from the Board of Directors Pool Committee. Keep an eye out in early to mid-December for an End of Year Park Survey. We'll be looking for your feedback from your experiences during the 2019 season.

• **Golf Cart License Plates:** Registration of plates was originally scheduled to begin on August 2019, with plates being required on all golf carts by August 2020. Due to delays in the production of plates, registration will begin in April 2020 with plates being required on all golf carts by April 2021. An update on the License Plate project is included in this edition of the Footprints and we've updated all of the information at SandyPines.com/LicensePlates to reflect the most recent changes.

The Inspector's Office would like to remind all members that you should be reading the Rulebook to see if the project you want to do requires a permit. Remember...by not getting a permit before you start the project it will cost you a fine and you will still need to pull the permit. Following the completion of the project, you must return the permit card.

We will be removing dead and damaged trees during the off season and into early spring, as long as the weather will allow it. Please remember to always be thinking about the June 10th lot clean-up deadline each year. As I indicated in a previous Footprints article, here is the Phase order that I will begin and end with next season as I begin my inspections: Phase 2, 1, 4, 5, 6 and 3.

SECURITY SERVICE NEWS

In October of 2019, Security Services responded to a total of 45 incidents. The types and numbers are as follows: Building Alarm: 1; Fire Alarm: 1; Animal Complaint: 1; Boat Complaint: 1; Check Wellbeing: 1; General Assistance Calls: 12; Health and Safety: 1; Larceny: 2; Medical: 3; Neighbor Dispute: 1; Open Door: 2; Property Damage Accident: 1; Misc. Rule Violation: 3; Suicidal Person: 1; Suspicious Incident: 7; Unauthorized Dumping: 1 and Unauthorized Entry: 2.

Site Security Checks: Our Security Services staff have resumed conducting site security checks for the off season. Security staff check the site for any issues including unsecured or open doors, damaged property and so forth. If your site is checked, you will receive an email regarding the site check. If anything urgent is found, our staff will attempt contact with the Member immediately.

Lake Safety Update: The Security Services patrol boat has been removed from the lake for the winter. The buoys have also been

removed. If you engage in late season activities on the lake, such as kayaking, please exercise caution, as there will be a delayed response due to the patrol boat being out of the water.

Unauthorized Dumping: Security Services continues to have issues with unauthorized dumping. Section V subsection D. of the Handbook has the rules regarding trash and disposal of leaf, brush and vegetation. Those rules include:

- No member shall bring trash of any kind into the Park
- Park removal of trash will result in an assessment and violation
- Large items such as sofas, old carpeting, sheds, and appliances are to be disposed of in a designated large dumpster across from the PSO Station. Hazardous materials or chemicals such as golf cart batteries or paint may not be disposed of in the Park

Note: The large dumpster described above has been removed for the season.

There are also rules posted on each compactor regarding what items may be placed in the compactor. These rules are enforced, and costs of removing hazardous materials or materials which jammed the compactor, will be assessed to the violator.

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LAKE MONTEREY GOLF COURSE NEWS

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ACCOUNTING UPDATES

The Sandy Pines staff is continuing to work hard during this off-season to tie up loose ends, finalize the year-end financial reports for Board and independent review, in addition to beginning the more extensive capital projects budgeted for our FY2020. We are also making continued progress through the budget planning, timeline and coordination of the Phase 4 Northshore FEMA Storm Shelter.

For your reference and information, below is the payment plan schedule if you have elected to make monthly installments to pay for your Annual Dues and Assessments. Your monthly payment this year is \$325.46, and is payable on the 25th of each month, from Oct

2019 thru March 2020. This payment plan is allowed for dues and assessments only. To stay current within the payment plan, your account balance owed for 2020 dues and assessments must equal the following on each date listed below:

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GOLF CART LICENSE PLATE UPDATE

The long awaited arrival of license plates is over. The unanticipated delay in production caused a delay in the time line of issuance. The timeline requirement to have the plates affixed to your golf cart has been moved forward. Golf cart license plates will be available for pickup at the Main Gate Public Safety office – April 1st 2020, and will be required on golf carts as of April 1st, 2021. For convenience of Phase 3 members, golf cart license plates will be available at the Phase 3 Public Safety Office Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day weekend.

Each membership site in the Park may have a maximum of two golf carts. Sandy Pines has in stock, golf cart license plates to accommodate a maximum of two golf carts per membership.

Step 1 - Registering your Golf cart(s):

Each member/owner in the Park is required to register their golf cart(s) with the Park. Registering your golf cart can be done online using Sandy Pines Web access, or in person at the Public Safety Office. You can assist the Public Safety Office by registering your golf cart online prior to picking up your golf cart license plates. You can use member web access at home or a Kiosk at Member Service or at Public Safety to register your golf cart. If you do not have online access, you can obtain a paper form at the Public Safety Office. If registering at the Public Safety Office a paper form will be provided for the owner/member to fill out.

A onetime cost for license plates (\$14/golf cart) will be included in the 2020 renewals. Sandy Pines will provide a renewal notice in January, 2020, listing the number of golf carts

that the membership has previously registered. Please take the time to review your renewal notice and the number of golf carts listed. March 15, 2020, is the deadline for changing or removing items from the renewals. Contact Member Service between January 15, 2020, and March 15, 2020, for additions or deletions on the renewals.

Golf cart registration stickers are still required on golf carts at a cost of \$15/golf cart. Please review your renewal form for the correct number of golf cart registration stickers. If you have added or removed a golf cart from your membership, please contact Member Service with the updated information.

After April 1st 2020, member/owners of memberships may add a new golf cart to their membership by using the online form via Member web access. The license plate cost will be billed to the member's account upon adding a golf cart. If you do not have online access, go to the Public Safety Office to fill out a paper golf cart registration form.

Step 2 - Bring Your Golf Cart to Public Safety for a Sandy Pines Vehicle Identification Number:

Each member/owner will be required to bring their golf cart to the Public Safety Office. A Sandy Pines Vehicle Identification Number will be assigned and recorded to the golf cart and affixed by Public Safety Staff on the steering column of the golf cart.

A front and back golf cart license plate will be issued to the member/owner of the golf cart depicting the site number of the membership by the Public Safety Office.

Step 3 - Install the License Plate on your Golf Cart:

Installation and display of the license plates on the golf cart is the responsibility of the owner/member. Golf cart license plate brackets are available at Park and Garden. If you need assistance in mounting your license plates, Park and Garden will offer this service for a nominal fee. Scheduling in advance is required. A list of other vendors will be provided by Public Safety that install license plates.

Requirements of installation of license plates:

1) A golf cart plate shall always be securely fastened in a horizontal position to the golf cart for which the plate is issued to prevent the plate from swinging.

2) The plate shall be attached front center of the bumper, at a height of not less than 12 inches from the ground, measured from the bottom of the plate, in a place and position that is clearly visible.

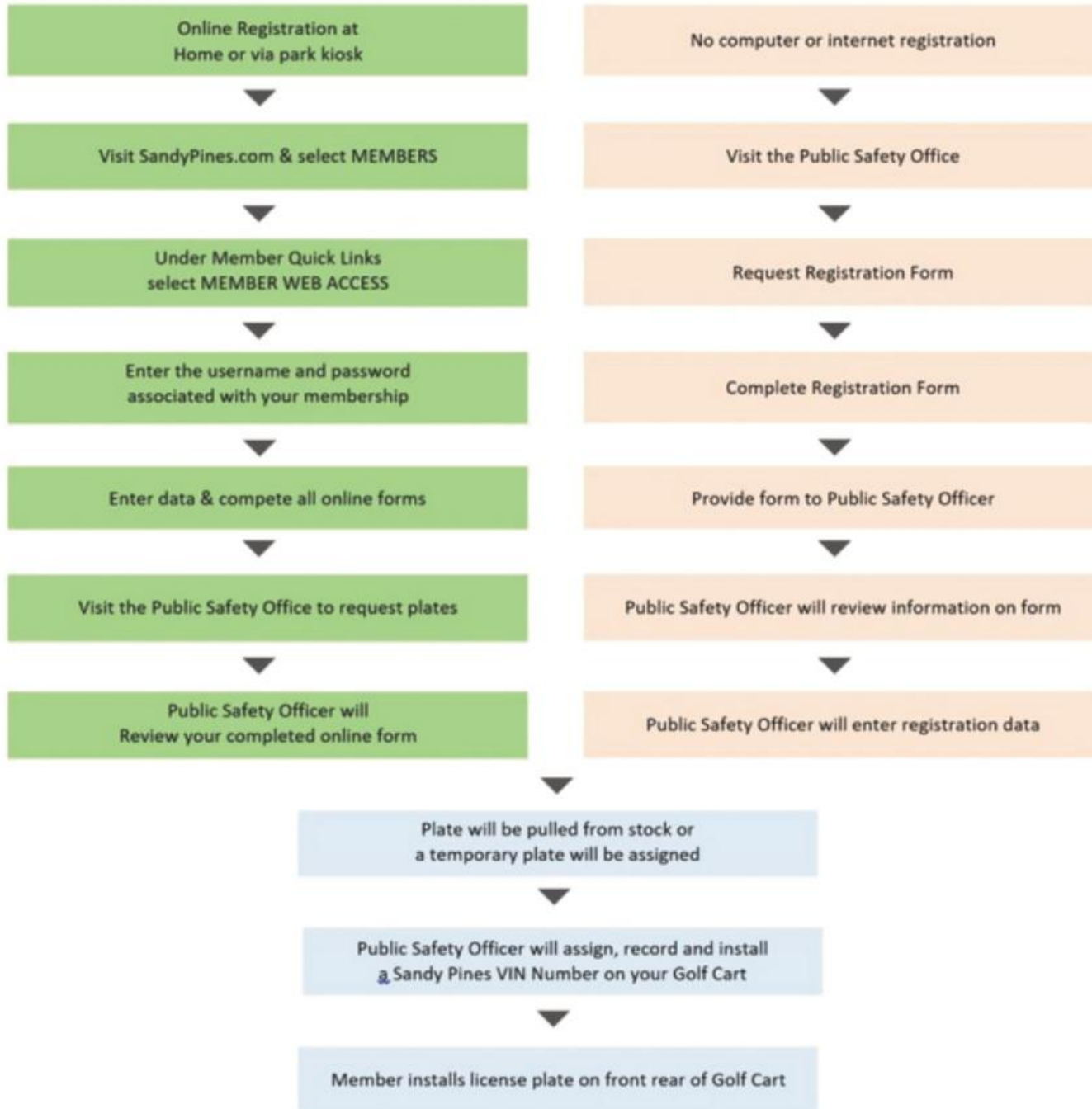
3) The plate shall be maintained free from foreign materials that obscure or partially obscure the registration sticker, and in a clearly legible condition.

4) The attachment of the plate to the rear of a golf cart; the plate shall be attached center of the bumper, at a height of not less than 12 inches from the ground, measured from the bottom of the plate; in a place and position that is clearly visible and not obstructed by a tow ball, removable hitch, or any other device designed to carry an object on the rear of a golf cart, including the object being carried.

POOL SURVEY (NOT VOTE) RESULTS ARE IN!

The Sandy Pines Board of Directors and members of the assembled Pool Committee are excited to share with you the results of the recent survey that was conducted this past November. Remember – this was a goal to simply find out if adding another pool would be an asset to the park, and should we pursue further investigating detailed costs, long range maintenance and operational costs associated with such an amenity.

Although we have voted on pool proposals in the past, many of the members have shared with the Board the following – either the proposals were not detailed enough to know what you were getting, or it was “tied” to something else within Capital and again not knowing what was truly being voted on. Our goal was to help use the latest survey data results to help guide us along this process of what the members want, and help shape a proposal that can be voted on this upcoming season, if warranted.

To highlight a few results, it is very clear that the members are passionate about wanting more pool space! We had a total of 1,932 responses and the data overwhelming supports a new pool. More than 92% of the respondents from members, followed by 7% from associate members, as the survey was not able to be locked down to only allow members voices, which was the intent. Wading (pun in-

tended since this is pool talk!) through literally thousands of comments spanning 235 pages, really helped guide us on our next steps, which is to put some options in front of the members to engage in a vote this coming season. Recognizing the need for transparency, communication and education of finances as to the “why’s and the how’s” is imperative for all of us.

Statistic notes of interest: nearly 50% of all respondents have been in the park more than 10 years. Greater than 50% of all respondents are actively working. More than 76% disagree/strongly disagree that current pool space is adequate for our park. More than 83% strongly agree/agree that they would value the additional asset of having another pool added to the park. Greater than 77% strongly agree/agree that they would be willing to invest in another pool that will benefit members even if it is a larger investment. Nearly 60% of respondents would prefer an indoor pool instead of another outdoor pool. Overwhelming majority would like a pool (preferably an indoor pool) to be built in Phase 4, near where the old pool was located.

A sampling of some of the comments covered a wide range of topics and emotions. Comments surrounding location, indoor vs. outdoor, and how to pay for it. Comments around financing such a project ranged from

paying down current assessments first (Golf before considering another assessment for a pool, capital and operational budgets. What is really needed due to the seasonality of the indoor/outdoor/park hours/etc. Numerous comments around making a wise investment which will increase our park values including several comments of “I don’t use the pool but would value the addition to the park”. Assessment options instead of raising dues is preferred by the majority, overcrowding of existing pools needs to be addressed ASAP, the size of the park (number of sites) warrants more pool space for all ages including teens, etc. Reviewing in greater detail these valuable comments will ensure that we spend our time wisely on any offerings put before the members for vote.

Again, many thanks to those who took the time to fill out the survey and share so many wonderful comments to help us, as a Board, listen to the members. Our next step as a committee is to continue meeting and to formulate a plan to move forward with more information, details and education, and to prepare a ballot of some sort next year.

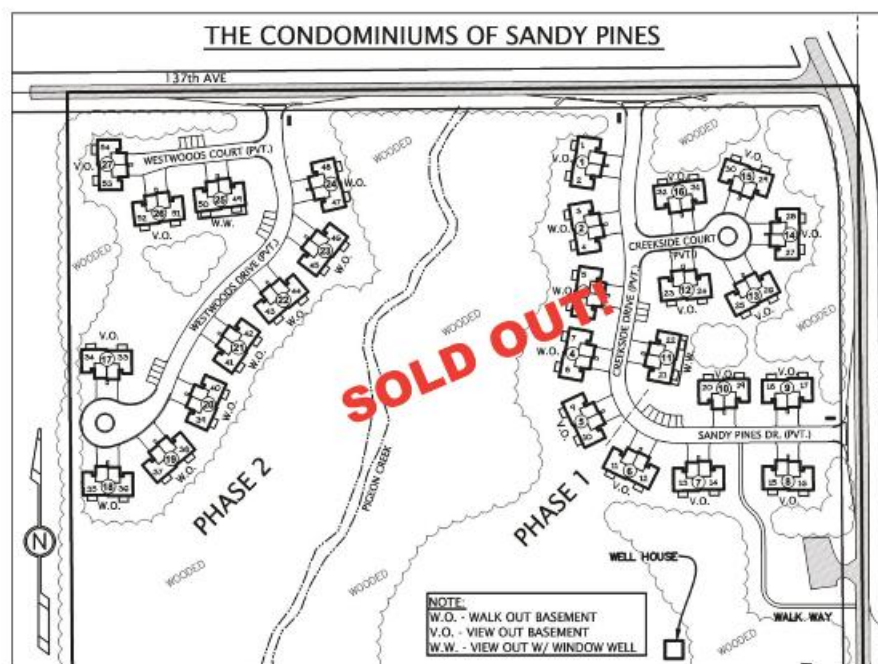
