Welcome Jeff to the team. We would also like to say goodbye to Ralph and Cheri Smith. Thank you for your hard work and dedication to our park and condo's. We will miss you dearly. You were always one to jump in, provide an extra helping hand and do whatever is needed for the team. Best wishes as Cheri and you return to Florida.

Park Restart Plan

We will be implementing Step 2 of our Restart Plan by allowing Associates and Guests access to the park. Even with the relaxing of the Governor's Executive Orders this month, please know that this awful COVID-19 virus has not gone away nor has there been a cure or vaccine developed. This means we still must maintain diligence in keeping our Staff, Members, Associates and Guests safe. We moved ahead opening all our

gates to allow members easy access to the park. We still have many events to keep our community active. Please see our Recreation Department update. Additionally, here is what you will see in the month of June.

June 8

- Guests and Camping will be allowed.
- New Guest Pass Policy will be in place. Members may go online through Member Web Access. Complete the Guest Pass request and choose either the \$5.00 option to self-print/email or the \$15.00 option for our PSO staff to print and deliver to your guest. We know this have been a hot topic. Our hope is that Members use the \$5.00 option as this is safer for our staff, guests, and members by limiting contact. The \$15.00 cost is temporary for this season to protect our staff and it is truly our desire to never have the membership utilize this option. We are working on a pre-printed pass that can be purchased in bundles at our Member Service or PSO buildings. Please look for additional updates on this option.
- Playgrounds will be open. Sandy Pines will be installing sanitizer stations at each playground. It will be the responsibility of

our members, associates, and guests to take proper precaution in sanitizing those who use it before and after use.

- Canoe and Kayak rentals will resume. Our rental team will be putting in place a process to clean items when returned after renting.
- CC's will resume regular operations and hours with staff continuing its normal cleaning service.
- Committees are welcome to start meeting again in an outdoor venue. We are still closing Phase 1 Pavilion and Administration Conference Rooms until further notice.

June 15

- For the safety of our staff, a new mail policy will take effect. Mail will no longer be delivered to the Administration building. Our Member Services team is not equipped or staffed to handle the high-volume packages nor do we have the PPE or ability to sanitize packages that may contain COVID-19. Therefore, we are moving all mail service to the mail building near the Public Safety Office. We have installed a security camera, magnetic locked door and proximity card reader. As the need arises, we will expand the number of mailboxes. Please contact Member Services for additional information.

June 22

- Pools will reopen. They will be open based on CDC, state, county and township suggested social distancing and capacity guidelines. The official plan will be released and communicated prior to June 22nd opening date. We are continuing our staffing process for our pools as we are in need of staff.

June 29

- The Site Cleanup Deadline has been extended from June 1

Other items our staff is working hard to provide answers and timing on include the ropes course, pavilion rentals, potlucks, bingo, and library to mention a few. Please continue to be patient with our staff who are working hard to get our members what we need. The indoor Recreation Station, arcade and fitness center remain closed until further notice.

Lastly, this is also the time to provide thanks to our Fathers on Father's Day. We thank them for what they mean to us and our families.

Please continue to review each department's section for any updates and changes our department leaders may be communicating. We are truly blessed with a great staff. Our staff has done a spectacular job getting the park ready for access while working with limited staffing levels. It is through great leadership in our departments that we continue to be ready to serve our members at Sandy Pines.

Covid-19, You and Your Family's Safety

The Covid-19 virus has influenced all our daily lives and the way in which we must change our activities each day. As the virus lockdowns and restrictions continue to go forth, we can become lax in doing the things that protect ourselves and our families. Being lax in doing the right things can have an impact on others. Being responsible for not only yourself and your family is a self-directed responsibility. The following are items that may seem to be small but can have a great impact on the reduction of the virus and increase the safety of you and your family.

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FINANCE & ACCOUNTING NEWS

Although the season of 2020 is not starting as anyone expected, we continue to focus on the financial strength of Sandy Pines and Lake Monterey Golf Course while keeping it a safe place for our members and employees. We remain attuned to the fluctuations in the financials through the drastic drops in generated income due to the global effect of COVID-19. We know this is a trying season and time in many lives, but we will continue to ride the storm and protect the safety of our beautiful park, which is made up of each of you and our wonderful staff working so diligently to get through these unrepresented times. The Board of Directors meeting occurred Friday, May 22, 2020 and included the review and approval of the March and April 2020 financial statements for both SPWT and LMGC.

Financial Statement Review

SPWT

- Operation Cash as of April 2020 is up approx. \$370k or 11.3% over prior year.
- The balance in the Operational Cash account includes the receipt of the PPP Loan funds approx. \$512k.
- The Charles Schwab Investment Account as of the end of April is up \$145k, approx. 8.5%.
- Total Member Accounts Receivable balance is significantly higher due to the delayed extension date to 6/25/2020 on the renewal's payment and the temporary Admin Office closure.
- The current expenditures for the FEMA building are recorded under Acquisitions – Grant Funded. A reimbursement request for the amount \$185,407 is still currently in submission with FEMA and was delayed to the current COVID-19 situation. There is no concern with receiving receipt of the payment.
- Current liabilities are up \$556k, primarily related to the currently liability hold of the PPP loan. A large portion of the loan is expected to be forgiven and SPWT is reviewing all aspects of the requirements to make the most of the funding provided. 75%+ of the funding will

be used for payroll as specified and Sandy Pines is working to retain and bring back as much staff as possible, while remaining in compliance with the Executive Orders set by the State of Michigan.

- Total Net Income is down \$220k or approx. 11.5% from prior year. This unfortunately is expected with the delayed start of the season and return of the pump outs not completed, camping and golf cart reservations cancelled, and the Sales Department closed through the State Executive Order. There is also an increase in Pension Expense due to the payments being made up front, rather than in arrears.
- Admin Net Expense costs are up approx. \$130k over prior year. This is a result of payroll being up from prior year due to staff restructuring over the fiscal year but is still in line with budget and expectations. The increase in sticker revenue is tied to the license plates and is equally offset by the expense incurred. Tree Removal cost is also up due to timing but is in line with budget.
- Maintenance overall is \$8.8k lower than prior year while still in line with the budget. The majority is of the increased expense is related to ground maintenance costs with repairs completely in the off-season.
- Public Safety experienced a \$8.8k reduction in gross revenue, specifically mag card income. Salaries have also increased 15%

over prior year with covered staffing through the pandemic and coordinating efforts while working with member accommodations. There were also additional salary costs during the overlap of training staff through the off-season. Overall, Public Safety is in line with the budget and therefore no major concerns. There is currently no activity to report in Recreation to date.

- Resort Services gross income is up \$60k or 1.7%. Operational expenses are down \$42k; 3% due to a reduction in Utility Costs through April 2020. Overall, Resort Services is up \$98.6k or 4.2%.
- Lease Operations is down \$3.9k or 4.3%. This is a result of a one-month delay in lease billings for our Ice Cream and Beauty Shop lease tenants. The Outback is in line with prior year since they were provided a one-month delay in their lease billing last year as well.
- Park and Garden gross sales is down \$24k, 93% due to the season delay in COVID-19 situation. Total Net income for Park and Garden is down \$15k due to the reduction of COGS and operational expenses.
- Rental gross sales are down \$25k with the cancellation in golf cart reservations in April and into the upcoming season. Total Operational Expenses is down \$3k, with total Net Income down \$22k.

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- The Retail Center has no significant changes from prior year, but is recognizing a pick-up from last year due to the high utilities incurred through construction in 2019.
- Sales and Camping noticed the largest drop from prior year. Sales is down \$11.5k and Camping is down \$133k or 45% due to cancellations already made up through May 31. Total Operational Expense is down \$22k or 19%. Total Net Income is down 34%.

LMGC

- Operation Cash as of April 2020 is down approx. \$52k or 13% over prior year. The balance in the Operational Cash account also includes the receipt of the PPP Loan funds approx. \$35k.
- Accounts Receivable is down due to the previous balance being paid up in 2019.
- Current Liabilities are down \$19.5k and includes the holding of the PPP loan liability. Just like SPWT, LMGC expects the majority of the PPP Loan to be forgiven with the golf course back in operation and staff returning to the park, as long as we stay in compliance with the State of Michigan Executive Orders.
- Total Gross Revenue is down \$15k or 5% due to reduced green fees but mostly due to decrease in food, beverage, and merchandise sales.
- Total Operational Expenses is increased \$42k or 24%. \$24k is related to Repairs and Maintenance on Equipment, \$12k to Repairs

and Maintenance to the Golf Course. There is also an increase in Pension Expense due to the payments being made up front, rather than in arrears.

- Total Net Income is down \$50k, 47%.

FY2021 Budget Review

The Board of Directors also reviewed and approved the first draft consideration of budget for the FY2020-2021 season. Specific highlights of departmental adjustments were also shared with the Board and presented at the Board of Directors meeting.

SPWT

- The Sandy Pines 2020/2021 Operational Budget is planned currently with a projection of a net reduction of increased expense in the amount of \$49k; which includes the planning net costs of the 50th Anniversary planning which is a one-time event and cost. We will continue to adjust the plans according in response to the effects of COVID-19.
- The CPI Increase to Operational Dues based on March 2020 is 1%.
- There are minimal changes projected through each department.
- The Cash decrease for the 2020/2021 year is projected to be \$30k.

LMGC

The Lake Monterey Golf Course 2020/2021 Operational Budget projects an increase in gross income reflective of the 2020 change in Member green fees.

The changes in Operational Expense are minimal. The 2020/2021 Operational Budget projects an increase in Net Income of \$27k.

This is only the early draft of consideration and adjustments will be made, as necessary, as determined by the current year's results.

Sandy Pines and Lake Monterey are remaining strong leading into the 2020 season with the multiple restrictions placed upon us through the Executive Orders set by the State of Michigan in safeguard of COVID-19. We thank you all for your patience and understanding as we try to navigate through these times. Smelly Water

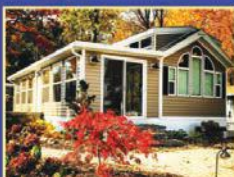
During the summer months, you may notice your water smelling like rotten eggs. This is usually caused by the magnesium rod in your hot water heater. The best way to flush the water out is to simply open the pop off relief valve on your water heater. Cold, fresh water will then flow into the bottom of your tank and force all the smelly water out the top. This is a good practice...not only to

flush the tank, but it also checks to ensure the relief valve is working properly. If the relief valve drips after you've opened it, the valve needs to be replaced. We have several contractors on our list who are able to perform this task for you, if required. Thanks to each of you for your help throughout the season. Enjoy Sandy Pines during the month of June!

New Shortened Saturday Hours

In order align with the Maintenance Team and implement ways to cut down costs, Member Service is changing Saturday Hours to 8am to 2pm.

Writing Checks for Payment

Member Service is accepting checks for account payments. Please send the top portion of your statement with your check. If you choose not to do so, please make sure your Site number is written correctly in the memo. Incorrect site numbers can lead to the payment being posted to the wrong account. Thank you!

Boat Registration Deadline

For 2020 only, the deadline for submission of your boat registration is July 31, 2020. Motorized boats previously registered can easily be renewed online. Wait time for return of the stickers has reduced from approximately one month to approximately 2 weeks.

Spectrum Cable & Internet

The Spectrum contract has been received and modem installations should begin mid June. We'll be contacting those who signed up as soon as we have the logistics. All park modems will soon be exchanged for new higher speed. The cost will not be billed to your account until the modem has been installed. Someone over the age of 18 must be present for the installation. As always, cable is directly connected to the coax port on your HD Clear QAM tuner capable television. We know it can be frustrating when electronics fail. At Member Service, we will always try to assist in trouble shooting electronic issues. Giving electronics a hard reset, scanning channels, bypassing your wireless router, and being beside your equipment to relay the working indicators are always the steps we are going to work through. Thank you for your patience. Additional details and troubleshooting info is available at SandyPines.com/CableInternet.

Park WIFI

As you move about the park, do not forget about the free park WIFI hotspots. All WIFI hot spots are on secure networks and require a password to logon. The network name at all park locations is "Sandy Pines-Guest". The password is printed on posters in each facility or you can obtain it at Member Service or the Public Safety Office.

Laundry Facilities

If you notice or experience issues with any washing machines, dryers or change machines in any of our Convenience Centers, please call WASH Laundry directly at 800-521-9938. They require the WASH ID number that is posted on each machine in order to dispatch a technician. Look for the WASH ID sticker on the machine that is malfunctioning and give them a call.

New ATM

There is a new ATM at Park & Garden. It is very user friendly and if you want to have your receipt sent to your smart phone, please have it handy. The vender assesses a \$3.00 fee; this would be in addition to any fees charged by your financial institution. The minimum withdrawal is \$20, and the increments are \$20 increments. I tried it – it worked well!

All Pump Out Plans have started; thus, we are no longer able to adjust to or add Pump Out Plans. We can assist you at Member Service with booking individual pump outs or you may do so through your Member Web Access. Remember to book your pump outs before your Phase day to get the regular rate of \$14. Those pump outs booked same day or on a non-phase day will cost the emergency rate of \$28.

Guest Passes & Member Cards

Thank you for understanding that issues regarding your guest passes and Member cards are not handled by Member Service. The software for and administration of these items is handled by our helpful and talented Public Safety office staff. During Renewal season, January 15 to March 16, we are able to make changes. After that date, card issues and guest pass issues are handled at Public Safety.

Mail Policy

Sandy Pines staff and facilities are not equipped with the proper PPE and supplies to manage the required disinfection criteria currently recommended for package handling.

Effective June 15, 2020: Only Members who pay \$35 annual rental for an assigned Sandy Pines Mailbox can receive mail and parcels at Sandy Pines.

Currently, there is limited availability of boxes; future expansion is being explored. Those who choose to have packages delivered do so at their own risk, as Sandy Pines will not be responsible for any condition, visible or invisible of delivered packages.

Members who do not have assigned mailboxes can no longer have parcels delivered to the Administration building. Non-Member campers and Associate Members cannot receive U.S. Mail at Sandy Pines, nor can they have parcels delivered.

There are many details to know regarding use of the Sandy Pines Postal Building as follows:

- Mailboxes are in the Postal Building which is located north of the main gate Public Safety Office.
- The postal building will be locked at all times and available only to mailbox holders with a proximity disk on their Member Card.
- Proximity disks can be purchased/added to your Member Card at the Public Safety Office. Cost is \$5.00 when initially added and \$5.00 annually to retain, billed with your annual renewals.
- The postal building is under electronic surveillance. The building will not be

physically monitored, nor will Sandy Pines staff sign for or take responsibility for your parcels.

- USPS will deliver mail in the boxes year-round, but you must be in the park and/or checking your mail regularly in order to keep receiving mail at your box.
- In the spring and fall, when you are ready to return to or depart the Park, please complete a forwarding card for the Post Office and allow 2 to 3 weeks for the change to take effect.
- If you are a mailbox holder, it is imperative to use the correct Sandy Pines address, otherwise your mail and packages will be returned to the sender. The correct address and format for mailbox holders is the following:

- Note the difference between 274"1" (your member mailbox address) and 274"5" (Our Administration Building address). If you use 2745 136th Avenue when sending to your mailbox and/or the word "box" or "PO Box" your mail will be returned to the sender as anything with "box" in the address gets sorted as an official USPS PO Box.

- **Please use ONLY this address for packages as well.** If they are too big to fit in your box, they will be placed in the front of the postal building on the floor or the shelves.
- If you can select which courier delivers your parcels, please select United States Postal Service.
- Please enable tracking services and notification for all parcels, especially if you receive medication or perishable items while at the park. Sandy Pines is not responsible for receipt or cold storage of any medications you have delivered.

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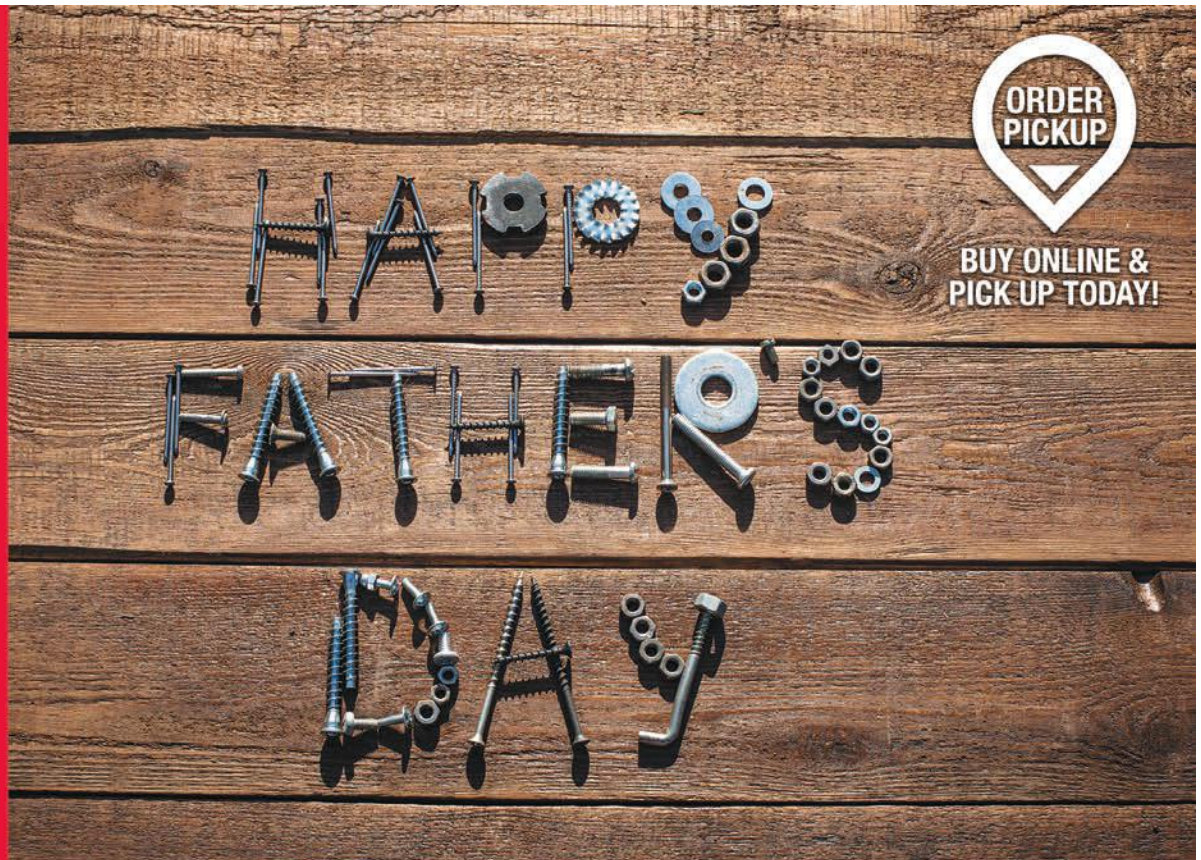

- Couriers will not leave tickets or messages in your box regarding packages.
- Members are responsible for mail keys and will be billed if lost or not returned when cancelling service.
- Please complete a “pink delivery ticket,” found in the postal building lobby. (See below.) The ticket allows the USPS courier to leave your parcels without a signature. If you prefer the package be taken to the Hopkins Post Office, please select that option on the ticket.
- We also recommend putting a note in your mailbox when you leave for the season. That way, if something arrives for you, it can be forwarded in your absence. It is also a good idea to place a written note in your box anytime you are on vacation or away from the park for a couple weeks or more.

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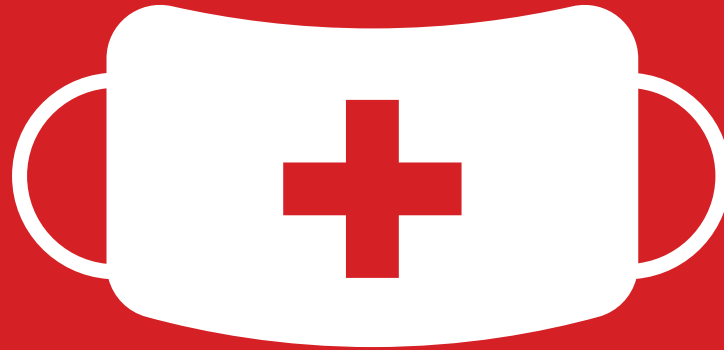
