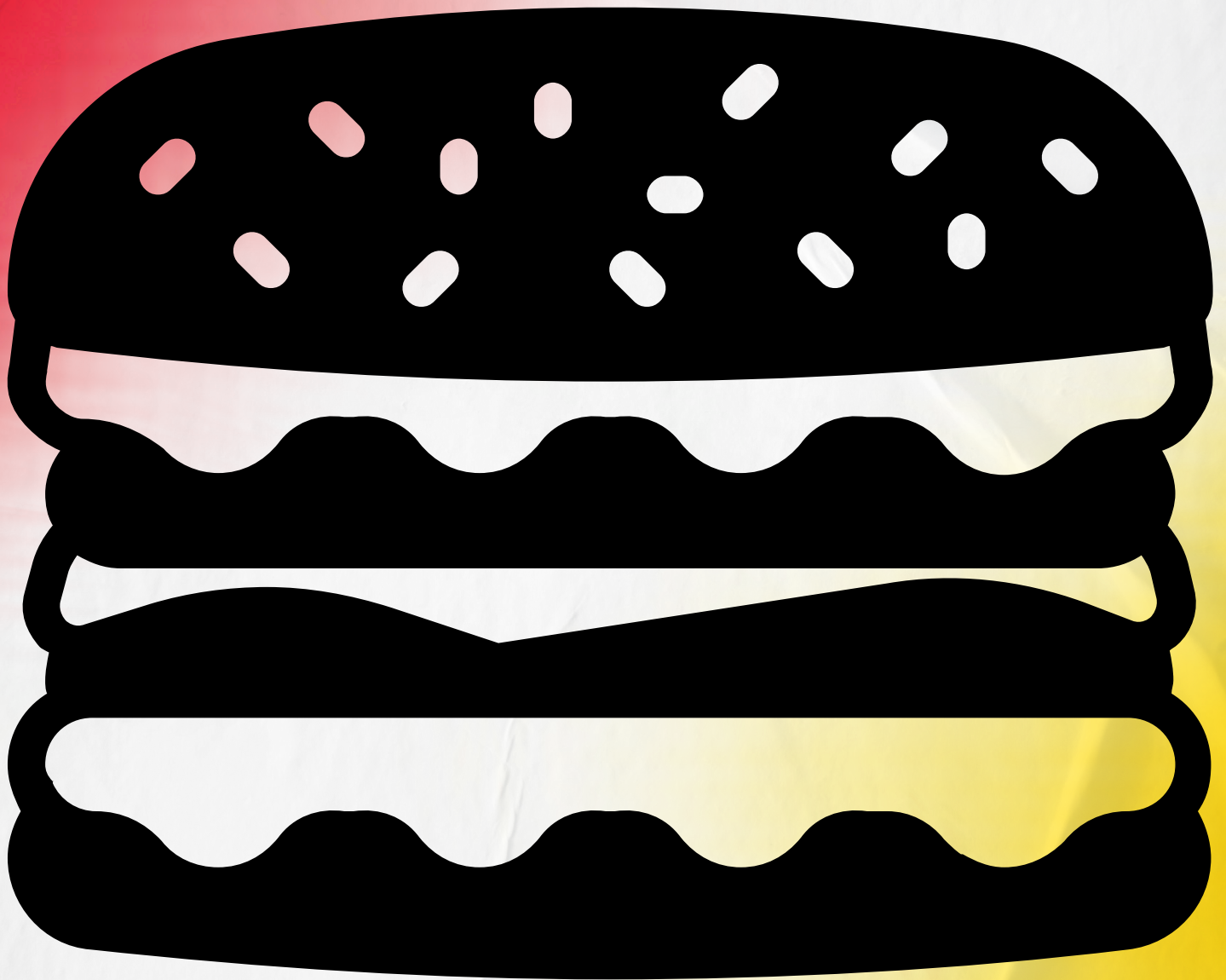

As you can see from May's board meeting, we have many things to accomplish this year. We are still reviewing and making recommendations for updating our rules based on the January 2026 EGLE Structures Letter. Last month the board passed many resolutions, tabled two and will have more to review. Please see summary below:

- Resolution 041726A – Trailer non-compliance and enforcement was approved
- Resolution 051526A – Garages, Golf Cart Shelter and Sheds was approved.
- Resolution 051526B – Shade Structures was tabled for

further language review.

- Resolution 051526C – Porches / Screened Enclosures was tabled for further language review.
- Resolution 051526D – Side-by-Sides was approved.

Capital Investment Project

We heard you! Over 1,200 members responded and we are listening! The future of Sandy Pines is in our hands. As members, we have the opportunity—and the responsibility—to invest in the long-term strength of our community by addressing aging structures, updating amenities, and planning for the needs of tomorrow while protecting our investments.

On May 16, 2026, during our first Capital Investment town hall, we rolled out a plan based on what the membership

communicated in our surveys. Members are asking all of us to address lake needs, amenities and depleting structures. Let's not forget about the behind-the-scenes operational capital needs to keep the park running. While trying to balance the needs (structures and operational) and wants (amenities), the current plan identified the following buckets:

- Lake Amenities (6 projects) - \$5.5M - \$5.8M
- Park Amenities (25 projects) - \$15.5M - \$16M
- Operational Assets (51 projects) - \$11.5M - \$11.6M
- Structural Assets (26 projects) - \$34.5M - \$35M

The Capital Investment Project is about more than repairs and improvements; it is about preserving the quality, beauty, and experience that make Sandy Pines such a special place for families today and for generations to come. By coming together with vision, commitment, and a shared purpose, we can ensure our park remains strong, welcoming, and prepared for the future to pass on for generations to come. Let's work together to build wisely, care deeply, and invest confidently in the continued success of Sandy Pines.

Watercraft Information

Motorized: Thank you all with motorized watercraft for getting your updates in by the June 1 deadline. State registration is required for those members with motorized watercraft only.

Non-motorized: All members with a non-motorized watercraft, please make sure your watercraft is identified clearly with your site number.

Laundry Facilities

If you're having issues getting the App to work. Please be sure to have your Bluetooth enabled. It must be on for the App to function and work with the machines. Once enabled it will then connect to the laundry room you are in. If this is your first time using the App, please follow the instructions on the laundry room wall above the kiosk.

For those utilizing the laundry card access, be sure to check

your balance and add funds at the kiosk if needed. The kiosk is located in the laundry room by car wash. No cash is accepted at the kiosk or at any machines.

Mailroom

If you are looking for postal service and/or package deliveries, stop by member service and reserve a mailbox today. Only members with a box are permitted to receive deliveries.

Renewal Stickers

If you have not yet picked up your stickers, please stop by member service asap and grab those. Only the primary members (site owners) may pick up. Please bring your member card or state ID for pick-up.

Portal Access

Members, if you are having trouble with your portal login and/or setup, please stop in or call member service for assistance. Your portal is so helpful in many ways. You can access your pump-out schedule, add or change property, and sign in your guests. Remember to always sign in your guests via your portal for a cost savings.

Pump-Outs

If you are not on a pump-out plan and you need a pump-out. Be sure to schedule the pump out:

- for the correct day of the week for your phase
- Schedule by midnight the day prior (phone messages do not apply)

All pump-outs ordered the same day are considered emergencies, and emergency fees will apply. All emergency pump-out orders must be in no later than 2:00 Monday-Friday and 11 am on Saturdays.

FINANCE & ACCOUNTING NEWS

As we begin the 2026 season, we look forward to another enjoyable and successful year at Sandy Pines. Below is an overview of the financial updates shared following the May Board of Directors meeting, including the review and approval of the April 2026 financial statements for both Sandy Pines Wilderness Trails (SPWT) and Lake Monterey Golf Course (LMGC).

Retail Gas Pump

As a reminder, the retail gas pump is available to both members and guests during the 2026 season and operates during the same hours as the Country Store. It was great to see activity at the pump over Memorial Day weekend and know that members and guests are taking advantage of this convenient service.

To comply with state regulations and emergency response protocols, a Country Store attendant must be on duty whenever retail gas transactions occur. We kindly ask everyone to use the gas pump safely and responsibly and appreciate your cooperation in following these requirements. If you have any questions or need assistance, please see the attendant on duty.

Sandy Pines Wilderness Trails

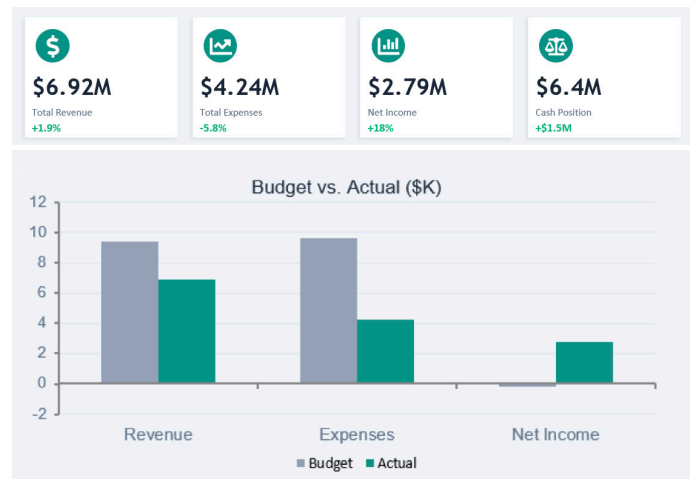
Sandy Pines Wilderness Trails reported a strong financial position through April 2026, with total year-to-date revenue of \$6.92 million and expenses of \$4.24 million, resulting in net income of \$2.79 million. Compared to the same period last year, revenue increased modestly while expenses declined, contributing to an improvement in net income of more than \$430,000. Cash reserves also remained strong at approximately \$6.4 million, reflecting an increase of about \$724,000 from March.

Key financial highlights include:

- Resort services remain the largest source of revenue, contributing \$5.30 million year to date.
- Maintenance income totaled \$536,273, performing significantly ahead of the prior year.
- Sales income reached \$549,745, slightly below last year's performance, while retail income also trailed prior-year levels.

- Overall expenses continue to trend below last year, helping offset softer performance in select revenue categories and supporting the organization's overall positive financial results.

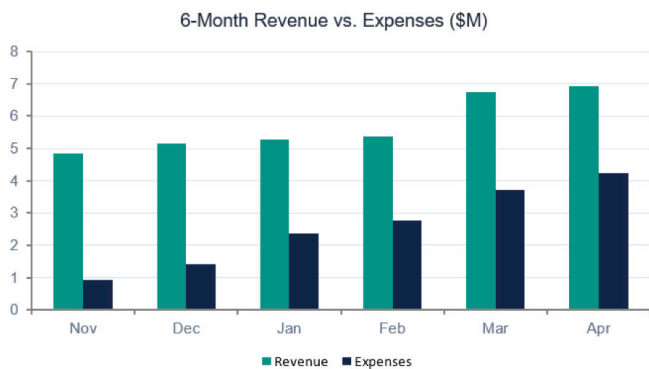


Graph 1: Sandy Pines key metrics, including revenue, expenses, net income, and cash position through April 2026.

Lake Monterey Golf Course

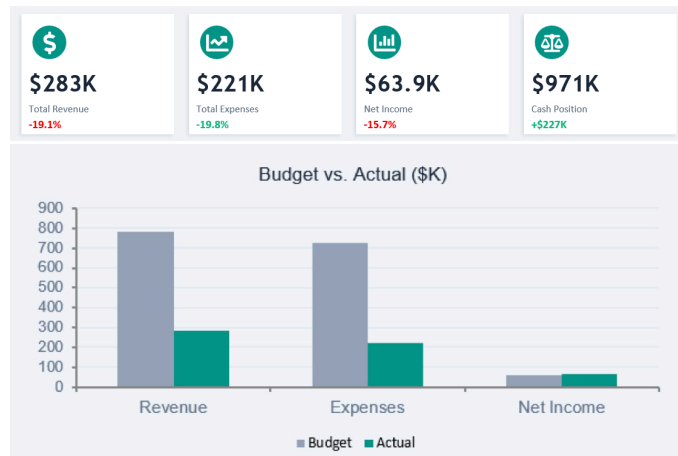
Lake Monterey Golf Course reported year-to-date revenue of \$282,852 and expenses of \$220,790 through April 2026, resulting in net income of \$63,948. While both revenue and net income trailed the prior year's pace, expenses also came in below last year's levels. The golf course maintained a strong cash position of approximately \$971,000, reflecting healthy liquidity as operations move into the peak golf season.

Key financial highlights include:

- Member assessments remain the largest source of revenue, totaling \$216,300 year to date.
- Green fee revenue reached approximately \$32,700 through April, with the majority of seasonal activity still ahead.
- Membership revenue totaled \$22,775, achieving more than 90% of the annual budget by the end of April.
- Food, beverage, and pro shop revenues remain relatively small contributors at this point in the year, which is typical during the early season.

Overall, Lake Monterey Golf Course remains in a stable

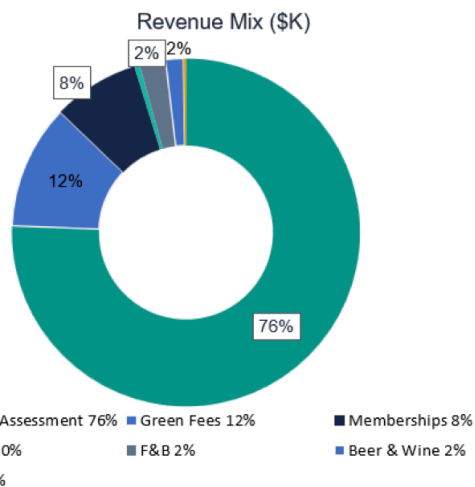
financial position heading into the busiest months of the golf season.

Summary

Overall, Sandy Pines continues to demonstrate strong and consistent financial performance, supported by steady revenue growth, controlled expenses, and a healthy cash position. As inflationary pressures are expected to continue impacting expense categories throughout the season, maintaining proactive strategies to manage and offset these increases will remain important to sustaining long-term financial stability.

Lake Monterey Golf Course also remains in a stable financial position, maintaining positive net income and solid liquidity

as it approaches its peak operating season. Together, both operations reflect a strong financial foundation and are well positioned to support ongoing operations, navigate future economic pressures, and achieve goals through the remainder of the fiscal year.

Looking Ahead: Operational Focus & Long-Term Planning

As we enter the busiest portion of the season, management is remaining focused on:

- Monitoring seasonal revenue growth and operational performance
- Managing staffing and efficiency during peak activity
- Evaluating utility, insurance, and professional service costs
- Maintaining strong cash management and reserve planning
- Continuing long-term capital planning to support future infrastructure needs

Additionally, significant work continues regarding the Capital Investment Proposal, which addresses aging infrastructure, roads, utilities, lakes, buildings, amenities, and future community improvements over the coming decades. The proposal reflects member feedback and focuses on protecting Sandy Pines' long-term value, safety, and member experience. Estimated long-term capital needs currently total approximately \$67–68 million across structures, amenities, operational assets, and lake improvements.

The goal remains clear: to thoughtfully invest in preserving and enhancing Sandy Pines for future generations while maintaining financial responsibility and operational strength. A long-range investment strategy for Sandy Pines Wilderness Trails, Inc. focused on protecting essential infrastructure, supporting member amenities, improving safety, and preserving the long-term experience of an 800+ acre recreational community centered around Lake Monterey.

Capital Renewal Focus: Lake preservation | Infrastructure reliability | Member amenities | Safety and stewardship

Executive Summary

Sandy Pines Wilderness Trails continues to focus on preserving and improving the shared assets that members enjoy every day — from Lake Monterey and road systems to recreation amenities, gathering spaces, and public safety infrastructure. This long-range capital proposal outlines a

proactive approach to maintaining the quality, safety, and experience of our 800+ acre member-owned community.

Key takeaway: This plan emphasizes practical renewal of the assets that shape daily life at Sandy Pines—lake systems, roads, utilities, buildings, safety-related improvements, and recreation amenities—so the community can preserve what members value while addressing long-term capital demands in a disciplined way.

Key Investment Areas

- **Lake Improvements:** \$5.5M–\$5.8M focused on lake wells, pumps, dredging, and water quality preservation.
- **Amenity Improvements:** \$15.5M–\$16M dedicated to pools, recreation courts, playgrounds, and shared

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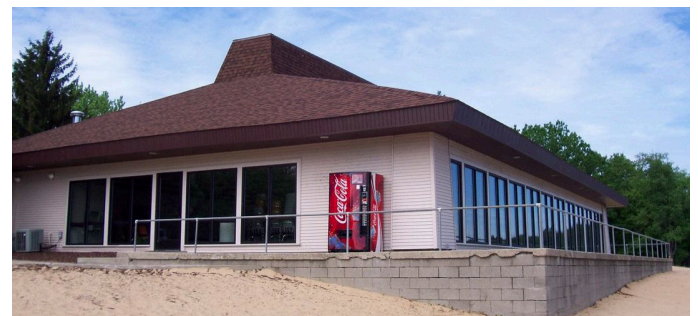
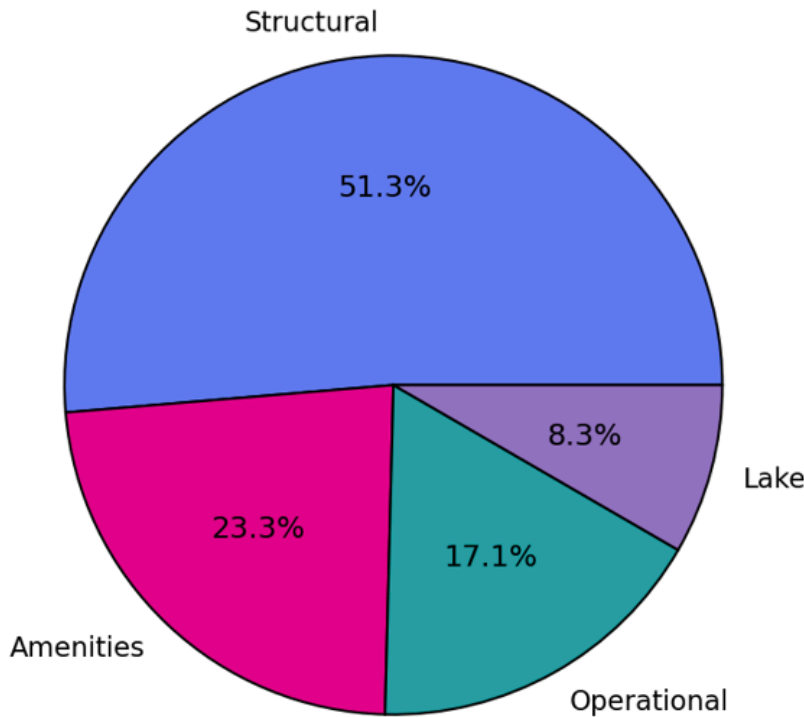

gathering spaces.

- **Operational Assets:** \$11.5M–\$11.6M supporting roads, utilities, equipment, and infrastructure reliability.
- **Structural Improvements:** \$34.5M–\$35M invested into buildings, pavilions, and convenience centers.

What members experience: A strong capital plan supports the parts of Sandy Pines members use every day—lake access, roads, recreation amenities, gathering spaces, safety services, and the overall quality of the shared community environment.

Operational Expense vs Capital Investment Comparison

For Sandy Pines, the distinction between operating needs and capital renewal is especially important because the community maintains a wide mix of assets, including Lake Monterey systems, internal roads, convenience centers, security and emergency resources, recreation facilities, and member-focused gathering spaces.

The table below highlights practical examples that distinguish day-to-day operating expenses from longer-term capital investments at Sandy Pines.

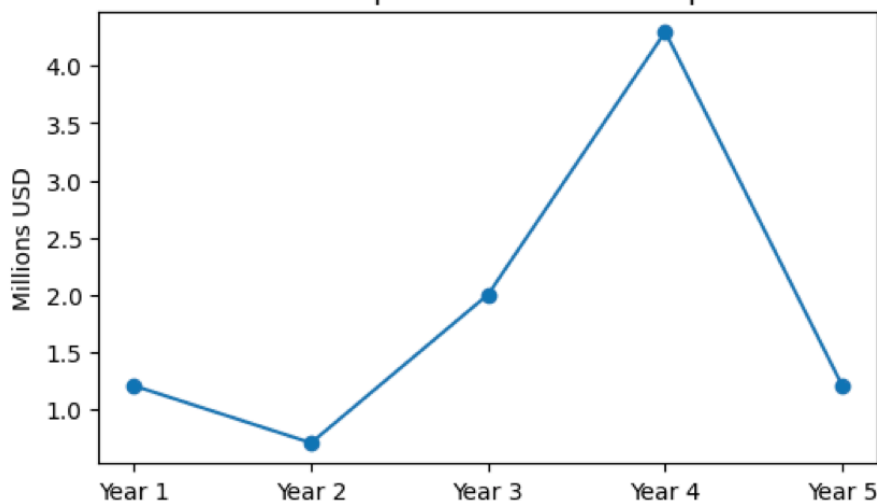

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First Five-Year Example

- Year 1: Lake wells, Rabbit River pump, pickleball expansion, patrol boat, road resurfacing.
- Year 2: Well pump houses, court updates, security equipment, HVAC and water softeners.
- Year 3: Convenience center renovation, additional pickleball expansion, road resurfacing.
- Year 4: Phase 1 core redevelopment and infrastructure improvements.
- Year 5: Additional road resurfacing, lake wells, vehicle replacements and renovations.

Alcohol Beverage Consumption in the Park

Drink adult beverages responsibly and adhere to the park rules. Sandy Pines permits consumption of alcoholic beverages confined to the campsite and at special events at the North Shore Center with licensed providers. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted in Park buildings, while driving in any mode of transportation, on beaches, or in public areas. Members should remind their guests and families of the park regulations regarding the consumption of alcohol within the park. Although we continue to ask the membership to abide by park rules, we still encounter people on golf carts with open alcohol containers, people under the influence on watercraft or vehicles, people off-site with alcoholic beverages, or people bringing alcohol to our pools.

Consumption of alcohol is confined to your campsite or to a campsite in which you are a guest.

Please confine consumption of alcohol to your campsite. Please do not attend the pool if you are under the influence of alcohol or recreational drugs.

Do not bring your personal alcoholic beverages to the golf course. The golf course has an alcoholic beverage license, which prohibits patrons from bringing their own personal beverages onto the property of the golf course.

RAVE Alerts

To receive RAVE Alerts, your email and phone number must be in the Sandy Pines Membership Database. If you share phone numbers or email addresses, only one of the people with the shared email or shared phone number will receive an alert notification.

If you are not receiving RAVE alerts, it is likely that we do not have your information. Please contact Member Service to provide your email and phone number so you receive alerts.

Pool & Beach Safety

It only takes a few seconds for a child to drown and for a preventable trauma/death from occurring. Pool Safety is based on layers of safety.

The first layer is physical, by placing fences and gates around a pool to control access.

Second is having staff monitor who enters the pool, and if children are under 12, have adult supervision. Unfortunately, staff also have to monitor for individuals who are under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol.

Third is having an adequate number of trained lifeguard staff and designated times in which the pool is open, supervised, and staffed.

Fourth is having rules, pool markings, and signage indicating the expectation of use by patrons.

Fifth is direct supervision by the parent or guardian of the child. Direct supervision is one of the most important layers to ensure a child's safety. It is always the responsibility of the parent or guardian to directly oversee/supervise their children. Relying on lifeguards to watch over your children is secondary to your oversight. Park staff is not a substitute for parental or guardian supervision. Pools are not intended to be drop-off zones or a day care facility. Older children may help but should not be relied upon to oversee younger children.

Sixth is enforcing the capacity of a pool. Large, unlimited crowds are difficult to oversee and supervise. Children move around and are hard to track when obstructed by others. This can create anxious moments for parents losing sight of their children and be more difficult when parents are providing supervision for several children. Large numbers of patrons on the pool deck and within the pools can create unsafe circumstances.

Seventh is awareness and observation. Reading books and using electronic devices poolside reduces awareness, observation, and supervision. Devices that distract from supervision of your youth should be used minimally. If you have youth at a pool facility, please refrain from bringing distracting devices or items.

If using the swim beach, please stay within the marked buoy area. People have swam to the island in the past. Some near misses have occurred with boaters. Please understand that you may not be visible to watercraft in the boating lanes. Please do not exceed your physical limitations in swimming to the island.

If you use watercraft, kayaks, or paddleboats on the lake and have passengers, please wear properly sized Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices. Almost all drownings could have been prevented if the person had worn a personal flotation device.

Fireworks

Fireworks - any explosive or incendiary devices are prohibited within Sandy Pines.

Please enjoy the fireworks display at Sandy Pines. Sparklers are permitted. Please use care and supervision, as they can cause severe burns.

Pets

Please keep your pet on a leash and under your control. Pets are not permitted to roam free within the park unleashed and not under the control of their owner. Be prepared to clean up after your pets waste. It is not ok to leave your pets waste behind. Pets are not permitted on designated swimming beaches. Designated swimming beaches are the Phase 1 beach and the Phase 4 beach.

Mobility Devices

If your family, child, or you utilize a scooter, skateboard, electric bike, bicycle, or other recreational device, please use it responsibly. Please supervise children, as small children may be hard to see by larger vehicles.

Sandy Pines is a recreational facility in which people should have the opportunity to recreate in various ways. These devices are a form of recreation and are presently permitted. If we want to have these devices in the park, they have to

comply with traffic rules and not become a nuisance. If they become seen as a nuisance vs. a recreational item, eventually, they have the potential to be banned from the park. Please supervise their use, utilize them safely, drive appropriately, and comply with the same traffic rules that apply to other vehicles. Other drivers should respect their presence and be watchful. As a park family, we all have to be proactive in looking out for one another.

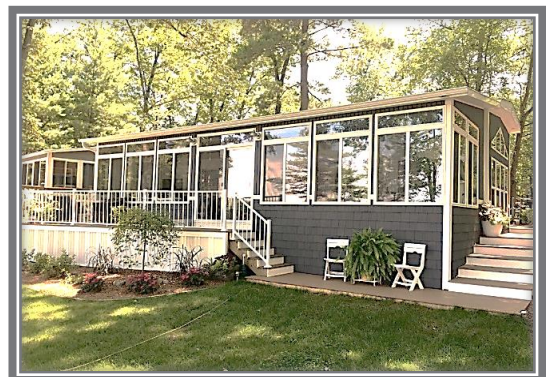
