This month will be extremely busy for all departments. The park will be transitioning to our off season, but the work does not stop. Please see below.

Board of Directors Executive Committee

Last month during our board of directors' meeting, the board executive committee nominations were officially voted, approved and communicated. Board of Directors Workshop

ANNUAL DUES

Dues, Capital Contributions, and Special Assessments are billed on October 1st. All charges to your account must be paid in full by October 25th to avoid service charges. Your final electric, unit tax, winterization fees and anything else that was billed to your account are due in full by October 25th, over and above the payment plan payment. Six monthly



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installments to pay only the dues & assessments in the amount of \$420.22 will be due by the 25th of every month, October through March. Dues can also be paid in advance by making larger payments, as long as you keep your account under the maximum monthly balances outlined top right: Monthly Payment \$420.22 Plus any additional items you had billed to your account! (1.5% interest on the unpaid monthly balance)

PLEASE NOTE THE PAYMENT PLAN TERMS & CONDITIONS!! Utilizing the payment plan automatically places your account 30 days past due because the balance is not paid in full. Thus, if you miss a payment during the term and your account balance exceeds the monthly maximum balance, your account becomes 60 days past due, and proximity card deactivation results.

Again, the payment plan option includes only the dues, capital contributions, cable, special assessments, and related service charges. The payment plan does not include any other fees and charges billed to your account. You must add all other charges for services, electricity, state unit tax, etc. to the monthly installment amount.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS UPDATE

The Board, Lake Committee, and Administration have worked tirelessly in preparation for dam reinforcement work to begin this fall. Local agencies and engineers are on board, bids have been vetted and secured, just needed a final OK from the State and we're golden, right? Fully expecting final approval when meeting with our "dam guy" last month, instead we were ambushed with yet another unforeseen obstacle. A flat "no" instead was received as he didn't approve of the plans submitted.

A little background. The cement side of the dam is in disrepair, having multiple cracks and fissures. The plan was to first allow the water level to get as low as possible, then fill in those crevices with appropriate material. It would then be covered by an extremely thick membrane, followed by a final coverage of rip rap (you can see an example of this product on the non-lake side of the dam). This would help preserve dam integrity via extra reinforcement while adding protection from boat waves. Experts from several departments agreed this was a logical choice. But the State "dam guy" said no, saying he wanted us to break up and remove all the concrete before any further modifications. This completely contradicts what all others have proposed. And it sends us back to square one with plans and corresponding bids from qualified contractors.

So what's next? Fortunately, the latest inspection of the dam (required every three years by the Township) gave us a "B" rating. We could, in essence, do nothing and still feel relatively comfortable. That said, it's still the only true protection we have of our number one asset. Therefore, we may seek remediation via our State Representative. Or reach out to the Army Corps of Engineers for their assistance. Regardless, because of this setback, dam work will not be completed this fall as originally intended. A frustrating scenario to say the least.

Members are rightfully frustrated at seeing a lack of progress with lake improvements. We share in your irritation. But this latest setback will not deter our efforts toward lake preservation, and we will continue to strive to overcome any and all objections to meet this goal. Hang in there, we'll make it! 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FINANCE & ACCOUNTING NEWS

As the 2023 summer season end, the Administration will be busy closing out the season and preparing for another great summer in 2024.

Your September 2023 billing will be sent the first week of October and include your final electric, state unit tax as well as any residual ancillary charges from the 2023 summer season. Your September 2023 bill will also include your 2024 Dues, Capital and Special Assessments for the next summer season, for a total amount of \$2,430, including an increase of \$77, in accordance with the 4.9% March 2023 CPI index for the year. Payment for the 2024 Dues and Assessments is due in full by October 25th, 2023 to avoid service charges or payable in six installment payments of \$420.22 by the 25th of every month, October thru March. The payment plan option includes only the dues, capital contributions, cable, special assessments, and related service charges. The payment plan does not include any other fees and charges billed to your account each month.


Financial Statement Review and Approval

The most recent August 2023 financial statements for both Sandy Pines Wilderness Trails and Lake Monterey Golf Course have been approved and posted on the Finance page (hyperlink at the very bottom of the webpage) at www.sandypines.com.

SPWT

- Operation cash in the month of August 2023 is down \$118k lower than the prior year. The current days cash on hand has dropped to 144 days which is still within the target goal for Sandy Pines.
- Current Liabilities as of August 2023 are down from last vear.
- Overall total Net Income is up \$240k as of August 2023.
 - o A major factor affecting this increase include the turnaround in unrealized loss in the Charles Schwab Account of \$223k in investments as well as the \$23.5k increase on interest income from 2022 to 2023.
 - Miscellaneous Income in Admin is up \$90k with the receipt of the ERC (Employee Retention Credit) filed.
 - Public Safety Gross Income is up \$30k with an increase in the income received for guest passes.
 - Recreation Net Income is down \$30k due to the changes at the Happy Shack concessions limiting the offerings to just food services, which is also offset with a decrease in the cost of goods sold for the Happy Shack as well.
 - Resort Services The final member electric billing will be reviewed, assessed and billed the last week of September.
 - Park and Garden is up \$80k as of the end of August 2023 with the additional of the Retail Country Store and Café. Salaries are up approximately

- \$18k to account for the additional work at the Store and Café. Overall, Park and Garden Net Income is \$10k from meeting the total budget for the year.
- o Golf Cart Rentals are up \$50k compared to last year and \$9.5k from budget for the fiscal year. Total Expenses is down \$10k from last year. and Net Income is \$56k over the budget for the fiscal year.
- o Retail is \$113k under the ytd budget. \$25k is related to a loss revenue with the delay on the gas pump installation, which based on reports the 3rd week in September the contractors are completing their final install this week and we will be testing the operations of the pump internally with our staff in the off-season and fully open to members next season. An additional \$80k expense was incurred in the retail center with repairs to the Store and Café prior to the season opening.
- o Sales within the park has increased from 30% to 50% and is up \$110k for the year. Sales Net Income is within \$236k of the ytd budget, but with the timing on an end of month sales deposit transfer will be \$93k over the ytd budget for the month of August.





LMGC

- Operations cash is up \$200k from last year.
- The proposed suggestion from Admin to pay \$100k this year on the Note Payable back to Sandy Pines was approved by both the Finance Committee and Board of Directors.

 Total Net Income for August ytd is up \$35k, related to an increase in Membership Dues, Green Fees, Food, Beer & Wine and Merchandise.

A full update of the final Fiscal Year End Close as of September 30, 2023 for both Sandy Pines and Lake Monterey Golf Course will be provided to the Finance Committee and Board of Directors for review and approval in the month of December and subsequently provided to the membership after approval. The independent financial review and tax filing by an external accounting firm will also be completed in the off-season.

I would also like to personally thank our many volunteers, especially those who were so gracious with their time to help

read and record the electric meters for each member site. Your support to Sandy Pines and the staff is tremendous and greatly helps streamline this process during a busy time of the year. You are greatly appreciated.

If at any time during the off-season you have questions, please do not hesitate to call, or message. Thank you all for being a part of the Sandy Pines Community and we wish you many blessings in your travels to your home away from your Sandy Pines happy place.

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SAFETY NEWS

Lake Level & Watercraft

If you have a watercraft on the lake, please be aware that the water level may lower in the fall. When water levels lower boats can become beached. Please be observant of the water level and your watercraft. Getting a beached watercraft off the like can be difficult and frustrating.

Preparing For The Fall/Winter Storage Mode

- 1. Secure and place outdoor items in shelter or storage.
- 2. Winterize your trailer prior to freezing temps and have your holding tank pumped before freezing temps.
- 3. Remove items that will freeze in cupboards. Remove alcoholic beverages from the park.
- 4. Defrost and clean your refrigerator. Place baking soda in the refrigerator to absorb odors.
- 5. Place moth balls under your trailer to deter critters. Place deacon or mouse proofer down to deter mice.
- Place golf carts in storage or affix to a stationary object or your second golf cart with chain and padlock to deter theft. A wheel can also be removed to deter theft. Disconnect batteries.
- 7. Turn off your propane tanks. Have your propane tanks filled if you plan to visit in the winter months. Have a furnace technician check your furnace for proper operation.

- 8. Have your watercraft winterized and place in storage. Outboard motors should be secured with chains and padlocks.
- 9. Contact your lawn service for fall leaf removal.
- Close vents, windows, and roll up awnings. Place pop up campers in storage mode. Have a technician check around roof vents for proper weather seal.
- 11. Turn off electric at the pedestal on the road.
- 12. Place stabilizer gas treatment in golf carts, lawn mowers, watercraft, and mopeds.
- 13. Remove boat dock from the lake and place far up on shore or place the boat dock on site. If you intend to leave your dock in the water after Nov. 1st, please apply for a permit from the State of Michigan through the Inspectors office.
- 14. Turn off your water at the water riser, disconnect your water line and mark your water line.
- 15. Make sure that Sandy Pines has your winter address and phone number. Update the park if you move in the winter. Leave an emergency contact name with the park if you plan to be out of state or a distance away in the winter months.
- 16. Remember to replace your smoke detector batteries before leaving this fall.

- 17. Remember to turn off your thermostat before leaving this winter. Some furnace blower motors will run if the furnace is left on, and temperatures drop.
- 18. Remove valuables and valuable items from your trailer for the winter months.

Fall Winter Weather

Fall weather can have brisk winds. Please take the time to secure golf cart covers, lawn furniture, and other small items. Winds have blown golf cart shelters over resulting in damage. Please check the anchoring of these golf cart shelters and secure.

Lawn & Leaf Cleanup

Across the street from the Security Station is a leaf dump for vegetation disposal. You may haul leaves and brush to this area in the back of a truck or by trailer. If you do not have a truck or trailer you may purchase paper yard waste bags at the Security Station and haul to the leaf dump or leave beside the road for maintenance pickup.

Please do not bring items from home to dispose of at the park. The dumpsters within the park are for items from the park.

FEMA Storm Shelter Update

Sandy Pines had applied for two storm shelters in the 2022 FEMA BRIC Hazard Mitigation grant application period. The bathrooms applied for grants were CC#1 and CC#2. At present CC#1 is still being considered as a potentially funded project. We have been advised by the State of Michigan and FEMA that the CC#2 project will not be funded this year. We continue to wait for the CC#1 Shelter/bathroom project to be funded.

Fortunately, Salem Township has assisted Sandy Pines in applying for Hazard Mitigation Grants. As we go forward, we look at convenience centers and determine CC's (bathrooms) that need to be replaced.

Construction costs/materials have increased over the past few years greatly. Projects funded by FEMA have a 75% /25% match for hardening costs. The result is a very strong/safe facility that has a long, low maintenance life at a reduced cost to the park. Most CC's are over 50 years old and continue to age.



Whether you believe in climate change/increasing storms or not, the issue of providing a safe shelter to persons within the park is the goal. Unfortunately, eventually a severe storm will move through Sandy Pines. I do not think that we can really imagine the devastation of a direct hit by a tornado. Life is precious and irreplaceable. Some people say it will never happen. Never is a long time.

A NOI (notice of intent) to replace CC#11 as a storm shelter/ bathroom with the State of Michigan has been submitted. The NOI will be reviewed by the State and determined if the project is eligible/feasible to be applied for as a FEMA Hazard Mitigation Project. We will also resubmit a NOI to replace CC#2 with the State of Michigan. The process is lengthy, challenging and sometime frustrating. We anticipate CC#1 to be funded in the future and will continue to move forward with potential projects.

Significant Others & Membership Cards

In the August newsletter the Board of Directors placed a resolution to be viewed and commented upon regarding people in relationships referred to as Significant others to be allowed to be and have an Associate membership card.

Much discussion happened at the level of rules committee meetings. I am sure that at the Board level discussion occurred. People are sometimes conservative and cautious of change. I do not think that being conservative and using caution is a bad thing. I think that this was one of those moments. Times change and adjustments need to be considered that reflect what is happening in society. The true intent is to review each of our families and what makes a family. Families and sharing the experience of being together is what the park is about.

I think that we can all reflect on members in our families that have long time relationships and sometimes have children because of the relationship. Under the old rule the son or daughter of a member could be an associate, the significant other could not be, but the grandchild (from the relationship) could be a member. I think that this change identifies the significant other as part of the family unit.

So, what is the wording:

Each associate would be allowed one significant other. Both parties must be at least 21 years of age or older.

Significant Other Definition: Means that a relationship exists between two people, neither of whom are married, that is intended to remain indefinitely and where there is a joint responsibility for each other's common welfare.

If you have an associate that fits into this scenario as a person eligible to be an associate member, please arrange to have this person added to your membership. Contact public safety or add at renewals in February/March of 2024.

The end of the season is upon us. Thank you for keeping our park looking great. There are a few things I would like to touch base on before we all head out for the winter.

Cleaning our lots at the end of the season is our normal practice so just a few things to keep in mind.

- 1. Try and get as many leaves as you can in the fall so there is less in the spring. Remember do not blow or rake leaves into the lake, or into your neighbors' lot. They should not be blown into green space as well.
- 2. Sticks and debris should not be put in or on the leaf bags that you put at the curb. Make a separate pile so it's easier for our maintenance team.

- 3. Keep anything that is parked in the driveway several feet off the road so that we can maintain the roads this winter.
- 4. Any gazebo on or off decks needs to be open on all sides at all times. No curtains or walls.
- 5. Nov 1 is the deadline to have boats and docks out of the lake for the season.
