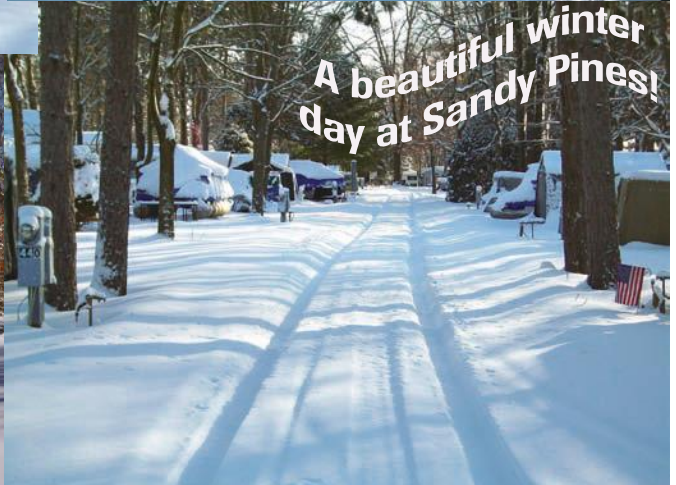

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SUMMER UPDATE ON ADULT RECREATION TRIPS

Hard to believe it's time to start talking about what we've got planned for you this summer already.

To date, I have three trips scheduled, and you can sign up for them by contacting Member Service or by stopping in the Administration Building.

Crossroads Village, Huckleberry Railroad and Fried Chicken will take place on **Wednesday, June 30th** with a cost of **\$98/person**.

Imagine a place where the air smells like fresh-pressed apples, warm cookies and wheat straw, and you can count on the train whistle to tell you when it's time for lunch! This is Crossroads Village today where 35 historic homes, barns, shops and trade buildings have been moved from around Genesee County to the edge of Mott Lake, and were brought o life again. Walk along the wooden plank sidewalk, stroll into the shops and hear the docents share the experiences that shape its history. The Huckleberry Railroad began its history in 2857, and was so named because it ran so slow; a person could jump off the train, pick huckleberries and jump back on with minimum effort, thus began an interesting history. The Genesee Belle has a delightful history of its own. In late afternoon, we will head for Frankenmuth and enjoy some free time exploring this enchanting Bavarian town before our included family-style chicken dinner at Zehnder's Restaurant.

Brown Bags, Haystacks and Legacy Five Gospel Music Show is our next trip, scheduled for **July 30th** with a cost of **\$123/person**.

In 1999, the Southern Gospel Music World was changed forever when the Cathedral Quartet announced their farewell tour after 39 years. After much prayer and consideration, Scott Fowler decided to take the legacy forward by forming a new group. God has blessed their efforts, along with major challenges, to press forward and become a tradition in their own right. Before their performance, we have a chance to sit back, relax and observe the Amish lifestyle as we travel through the picturesque back roads of Northern Indiana. We'll step back in time and learn about the plain people. With a knowledgeable local guide, we'll hear about the history of the area and the traditions and customs of the Amish. Bag some fun – each tour member receives a Brown Bag. As we visit unique, locally owned Amish shops and homes along the way, we receive a special treat to help fill our "Brown Bag." Our day begins with a Cinnamon-caramel donut and a cup of coffee – then it's off to visit several Amish attractions, including our included "Haystack Lunch" in an Amish home. The tour concludes in Shipshewana for a self-pay dinner before we enter the Blue Gate Theatre and our "Legacy Five" Gospel Music Show.

From State-of-the-Art Technology to "Lazy River Cruisin!" is our next trip, scheduled for **September 2nd**, with a cost of **\$117/person**.

As quirky, off-the-beaten-path attractions go, it's hard to top Fair Oaks Farms, a working dairy farm with a 21st Century flair. This is a state-of-the-art facility, in a story-

book setting. The farm is home to 30,000 Holstein dairy cows and produces 80-100 calves per day in its birthing barn theater. Watch as cows, creatures of habit, load themselves onto milking carousels for the five-minute milking process. A bus tour of the farm acquaints us with techniques used to recycle farm waste into electricity, as well as many other unique innovations, and a 3-D interactive movie to educate us further. As we enter the restaurant, we view cheese-making, then enjoy our self-pay lunch, dining on products made right on the premises. Mid-afternoon finds us motoring our way to Elkhart, where we board the Elkhart River Queen, a restored 1948 paddle boat. We then cruise the majestic St. Joseph River while dining on our Essenhaus Restaurants' famed catered buffet dinner. This two-hour narrated cruise highlights the influence of the river on the history of the area towns. After dinner, take a stroll to the top deck and watch the beauty of the river and scenic shores glide by. We then say goodbye to Indiana and return to Sandy Pines.

Keep reading the Footprints for updated information and more scheduled trips, as they become known. Looking forward to a great 2010 at Sandy Pines!

PARK RANGER NEWS by Steve Deyarmond

Weather siren:

The weather siren located in the Park is activated by Allegan County Central Dispatch. This weather siren is tested the fourth Friday of each month at around 11am. The weather siren is activated for severe weather threats as determined by Allegan County Emergency Management. When activated members and their families should seek shelter. Each family should have a family discussion on a pre-planned place to take shelter, and parents should talk to their youth in reference to other alternatives if out on the golf cart, or out on the lake in a boat.

Members should be observant to changing weather conditions and watches. Members should monitor local TV or radio stations for weather threats, and also should consider purchasing a weather alert radio.

Membership cards:

Members may purchase membership cards at the Ranger Station. The cost for a new membership card is \$10. Membership cards may be purchased for spouses, parents, grandparents, children and grandchildren. Membership cards that were deactivated because of a past due balance will be reactivated at the following fee schedule (if all cards are activated at the same time):

One Card - \$20

Two Cards - \$40

Three-Four Cards - \$55

Five or more Cards - \$80

Membership Cards reactivated individually will still cost \$20 each to reactivate.

Sandy Pines Vehicle Stickers:

Sandy Pines vehicle stickers are issued at no cost to members, associate members and grandchildren. The Ranger staff will need

the member's membership card and the vehicle registration to issue a vehicle sticker. If you have changed your vehicle, or received a new license plate, please stop by the Ranger Station to update your information.

Leaf and Brush Disposal:

A leaf dump is located across the street from the Main Gate Ranger Station. This leaf dump is for biodegradable items only such as leaves, pine needles, brush, grass clippings, and other biodegradable lawn waste. Please do not dispose of lawn waste in the small dumpsters inside the Park. We also have large dumpsters in this area. These dumpsters are for large items from your trailer or campsite. Please do not bring items from home to dispose of at the Park.

Golf Cart and Watercraft Registration stickers:

Sandy Pines requires golf carts and watercraft to display a current year registration sticker. Golf cart registration stickers can be purchased at the Ranger Station or at the Member Services office. Watercraft registration stickers can be purchased at the Member Services office. A current copy of your watercraft registration is required.

Operation of Golf Carts by youth:

Youth 12 years of age must take, and pass, the Golf Cart Safety Program in order to operate a golf cart in the Park with an adult. Youth wishing to receive a golf cart driving permit must stop at the Ranger Station, pickup a Golf Cart Safety Study Guide. The youth should study the information and the parent should review the information with their child. After the Golf Cart Safety Guide has been studied, you may stop at the Ranger Station and take

a written test. After the 12 year old passes the written test he/she will be issued a Golf Cart Driving Permit to operate a golf cart with an adult. Twelve year old drivers must have an adult present on the golf cart.

If you are 13 years of age or older, you may also pick up a Golf Cart Safety Guide to study so you can operate a golf cart within the Park. After the packet has been studied, it is a good idea to have a parent review the information with the youth. After that, the youth can stop at the Ranger Station to take a written test. When the youth passes the written test, he/she must operate the golf cart with an adult for three weeks.

Proof of age is required to take the golf cart test. Proof of age can be a birth certificate, passport, or school ID indicating age.

Fifteen year olds with state issued auto driving permits do not have to take the Golf Cart Driving Safety Course.

All golf carts operated within the Park must have \$100,000 liability insurance coverage.

Rental Golf carts:

To operate a rental golf cart within the Park, an individual must be at least 18 years of age, with a valid state issued operators permit. In the event that a person is found operating a rental golf cart within the Park that is under the age of 18 years, the Ranger staff will stop the golf cart, take the rental golf keys, issue a violation, and inform the rental agency. This may result in the loss of use of the rental golf cart and any rental fees.

Mopeds and Scooters:

Two wheeled scooters with a seat and a motor are permitted within the Park. Motorized scooters with-

out a seat are not permitted. Youth must be 15 years or older and must have a State issued Vehicle License or Moped License to operate a moped or a park approved Motorized Scooter in the Park.

Mopeds must have a moped registration sticker and the membership site numbers on the front and rear of the moped, at least two inches in height

All mopeds/scooters operated within the Park must have \$100,000 liability insurance coverage.


