



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## Letter From the President

Greetings Dear Friends,

Depending on where you have spent your winter months; The Worst or the Best is over! The worst, if you have been in Michigan, and the best if you have been in warm weather. February was a short month and March is just around the corner from April, so spring is now only days away!!

If you have seen the photos of the Park that have been posted on our Facebook page, you can see that in February the roads here at Sandy Pines were pretty much down to one lane. Your Maintenance Staff has spent more time on plowing snow and repairing plow trucks than they care to remember, but they got the job done, and did it well. We need to thank them for their perseverance and determination to keep Sandy Pines roads accessible during this winter.

Our marketing efforts continue to evolve in an effort to improve the visibility (or Brand Awareness) of Sandy Pines. New marketing strategies are being implemented based on their ability to provide solid data for results, as much as possible for the dollars we spend, rather than throwing money out there and "hoping" someone notices.

We have had a great experience with our social media marketing efforts on Facebook that began in 2013. We now have over 1,400 "likes" (or people following us), and our site reaches anywhere from 6,000-12,000 people per week. In 2014, we have contracted with Mlive to enhance our social media marketing reach and effectiveness, on Facebook, twitter and google plus, so please follow us on all three, and tell your friends to do so, as well. The intent of this is to expand the "conversation" and bring awareness to Sandy Pines and Lake Monterey Golf Course.

Additionally, as many of you are already aware, (we announced in the February Footprints) we had a new show display designed and built for Sandy Pines and Lake Monterey Golf Course, thanks in large part to the help of two Members. We have attended two RV shows and have received great reviews and have drawn more attention to Sandy Pines with this new display. As I write this, we are preparing to attend the Grand Rapids Golf Show for the first time, and we are very excited about that. I'll be looking forward to reporting how that show went in the April Footprints.

As we move forward with increasing our Brand Awareness, it is my hope that we will be able to add a part time (eventually full time) Marketing position within the next two years. This position would be instrumental in managing marketing consistency (the message) while diversifying the media use (the method). In addition to supporting and improving Brand Awareness, this position will be managing the communications with the Members as well. After the many changes we made last year to improve communications, we cannot stop and say "well now we're communicating with the Members"! This will be an ever evolving effort and it's my belief that we will benefit by having trained personnel in this position to make those efforts successful.

We also will be doing a six week trial television ad run that includes 945 – 30 second ads on CNN, FOOD NETWORK, FOX NEWS, TBS AND TLC Charter cable stations. This trial television marketing effort will be done in three markets: Kalamazoo, (36,000 viewers) Rockford (25,000 viewers) and Grand Haven/Ottawa County (25,000 viewers).

During February, much of the laundry equipment was removed, and the areas were prepared for new equipment to be installed. Some areas were painted, the laundry in the retail center will have a new ceiling installed, along with the restrooms and showers in the Recreation Station. The ceilings were replaced due to the rusting and curling of the frame and tiles caused by the high humidity environment.

With the change in laundry equipment, you will also notice that some of the equipment will accept credit cards, so you don't have to come to the laundry with a basket full of quarters any longer. All the machines will still accept quarters with about half of the machines in each laundry having the capability to take a credit card. Note: due to the tough winter conditions, it make take a little longer to get an internet connection to all Laundromats by April 15th, but we'll do our best to make it happen.

When you come to the Park, be sure to check out the tile floors in the restrooms and showers in the Convenience Centers, the Adult Recreation Center and the Ranger Station. In February we contracted to have all the tile floors steam cleaned and we think they look great! (Even the floors in the oldest CC's!)

I want to take a short moment to extend my thanks to Salem Township for their willingness to work with us in taking a closer look at our property tax costs. Through a spirit of cooperation, Salem Township and Sandy Pines came to an agreement wherein the Township has reduced our property taxes on the Park property by \$25,000.00 per year.

On February 27th, we sponsored a Work Session with our Staff that included a morning dedicated to helping us improve our skills at Conflict Resolution, and the afternoon session dedicated to Customer Service. We want to thank Erika Duncan , Vice President of Human Resources (site N-28) Metro Health, for bringing in Kimberly Healy, Director of Human Resources, Metro Health to help us improve our skills with the focus on improving our ability to serve you our Members and our Guests.

The work of planning for the summer of 2014 continues, and with each meeting we are getting closer to finalizing event plans. The final planning details continue to be made with each consideration carefully thought over to do our best to ensure that these events will be a positive experience for all of our Members and Guests. Please continue to watch our website and social media for a 2014 calendar so you can make plans to invite family and friends. We look forward to your participation and attendance!

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## Comments, Suggestions and Questions

Thanks to those who have asked the hard questions, made great suggestions and provided critical and/or constructive comments!

**Q: I heard that you (Gene) owns the company that supplies the sandwiches to the golf course pro-shop. Is that true?**

A. No. Joyce and I do have a snack food company based out of Traverse City that we are Partners in with some good friends, but no sandwich company. The sandwiches come out of Fremont, Michigan.

**Q. So based on an article by Ranger Steve in last month's Footprints, it seems that some Members are taking advantage of Sandy Pines and through fraud, they are costing the Park money. My question is; if people are caught at using the Park and our amenities as an Associate Member, when they are not qualified to be an Associate, what are you going to do to them?**

A. If we find that a Member has improperly assigned an unqualified person or persons as Associate Members allowing those persons to have used the Park and amenities, such as the golf course, we will bill the Member for the round(s) that have been played. If the amount of use is under \$500, the Member will be charged double for the amounts that were not paid as a non-member. If the amount is over \$500, I'm not sure at this time what can be done, but I would not rule out the potential that we would petition the Board for expulsion of the Member.

**Q. Why do I have to pay a boat stake fee if I am renting a boat dock? I'm getting double dipped!**

A. First, the premise that you are renting the boat stake is incorrect. Sandy Pines does not charge for boat stakes. For a Member to hold a boat stake, they need to have a boat registered to that stake. The registered boat must have a current Water Sticker on it. If you rent a boat dock, unlike the stakes, you pay one fee for the dock, however, and you pay another fee for a Water Sticker for the watercraft, as do Members for a boat stake. It is my understanding that boat docks and water stickers were one price a number of years ago, however at some point (3-4 years ago?) the water sticker was separated from the dock rent. From what I've been told, the combination boat dock/water sticker fee may have been done originally as an incentive to rent the docks.

**Q. Why can't Sandy Pines have a sign on 131 at the exit like another camp ground has?**

A. We can, in fact we have ordered a north and south bound sign at the Dorr exit (exit 68). Our logo will be on display on the highway and at the exit on the "Camping" sign. We think the highway sign will be a complementary addition to the new directional signs we had installed last year. It's our goal to increase Sandy Pines Brand awareness, and the signs are a way for folks to easily find us.



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# Safety Department Update

## Golf Cart, Moped:

All golf carts and/or mopeds in the Park must be registered, and display a current year registration sticker. Golf cart and moped registration stickers can be purchased at the administration office or the Ranger Station.

Golf carts must display the registration sticker on the right rear fender or bumper of the golf cart in a visible location. Mopeds must display the Moped registration sticker in a visible location on the rear fender. Site numbers must also be displayed on the front and rear of the golf cart. The site numbers must be at least 3" in height, in contrasting color to the golf cart and visibly displayed.

Mopeds must display site number on the front and rear of the moped at least 2" in height and in a contrasting color, located in a visible location.

**Watercraft registration stickers must be purchased at the Administration Office. Your current watercraft registration is required.**

## Golf cart driving permits:

Youth, 12 years of age or older wishing to drive a golf cart must take the Golf Cart Safety Course to operate a golf cart in the Park. The safety packet information is online at the SandyPines.com website or you may pick up a hard copy at the Ranger Station. A hard copy of the Golf Cart Safety Packet is \$2. After the youth studies the packet he/she may come to the Ranger Station, show proof of age, and take the written test. When he/she passes, they will be issued a permit to drive a golf cart in the Park. If they are twelve years of age, he or she must operate the golf cart with an adult (18 yrs. of age or older). If they are 13, they must operate the golf cart with an adult for three weeks after passing the written course. A youth golf cart permit is \$5.

## Rental golf carts:

To operate a rental cart in the Park a person must be at least 18 years of age. Please remind your family members and guests.

## Weather siren:

The weather siren located in the Park is activated by Allegan County Central Dispatch. This weather siren is tested the fourth Friday of each month at around 11 am. The weather siren is activated for severe weather threats as determined by Allegan County Emergency Management. When activated, members and their families should seek shelter. Each family should have a family discussion of a pre-planned place to take shelter. Parents should talk to their children about alternatives if they happen to be out on the golf cart or out on the lake in a boat. Members should be observant to changing weather conditions and watches. Members should monitor local TV or radio stations for weather threats and also should consider purchasing a weather alert radio.

## Stroke:

If a family member was having a Stroke would you recognize the symptom and know what to do? Maybe? On a national average, those experiencing a stroke fail to be seen by an emergency room, in a timely manner.

Staff have responded to medical emergencies in the Park in which a person suffered from a stroke and waited overnight or several hours before seeking medical help. Individuals with symptoms of stroke should seek emergency medical attention immediately. In many cases the effects and disabilities of a stroke can be reduced greatly if treated as a true medical emergency. In many cases the person makes

a full recovery if treated in time. If left untreated, the results of a stroke can leave a person disabled for an extended time, for life or even cause death. It is very important to get immediate help.

Two types of stroke exist. About 87% of strokes are caused by a blockage or clot. These are called ischemic strokes. The second type of stroke is a hemorrhagic stroke, which is a bleed in your brain.

A person experiencing a stroke should be treated with clot busters within three hours from the onset of symptoms. This is the time frame in which the blood clot busting medication can be given to reverse the effects/disabilities of an ischemic stroke, with the best possible outcome. The faster the stroke is treated, the better prognosis for the stroke victim. Time is Brain. The longer the person waits to be treated, the more damage to the brain. Understand that the person with a brain injury may not be thinking properly, and as a family member or friend, you may have to make the decision to get the person help. If you or a family member have any of the following symptoms call 911 immediately.

### What symptoms might a person have that is having a stroke?

- Sudden, unexplained, severe headache
- Facial droop, unsymmetrical smile, face numbness
- Dizziness, loss of balance, sudden trouble walking
- Unable to speak, slurred speech, unable to express thoughts or speech not making sense
- Numbness in arms or legs, weakness in arms and legs or decreased ability to raise arms or legs
- Weakness or paralysis on one side
- Confused, trouble understanding
- Unable to swallow
- Visual disturbances, flashing dots, blind spots, blurred vision
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes

The person with symptoms should go to an accredited Stroke Center. Stroke Centers near Sandy Pines would include Metropolitan Hospital, St. Mary's Hospital, and Spectrum Butterworth. Stroke is a leading cause of death in the United States, killing nearly 130,000 Americans each year—that's one of every 19 deaths.

We must have an up to date state boat registration by June 1st. After June 1st, your boat stake will be opened up for someone that is on the boat stake waiting list. You can email a copy to [memberservice@sandypines.com](mailto:memberservice@sandypines.com) or fax a copy to 616-896-7409.

### Mailbox Renters:

Before you head back to Sandy Pines you must turn in a temporary forwarding card to the Post Office. Make sure to list all names (including business names) that will be using your mailbox unit number. The Post Office does not inform the office when you are coming back, so be sure to let us know that you will be using your Sandy Pines box again.

### 2014 Flea Markets:

### Non-motorized Boats:

The Board of Directors amended the Watercraft Regulations regarding non-motorized boats effective 1/1/2014. Canoes, kayaks, paddleboats and single or two person sailboats **that do not park at a boat stake or dock space**, will no longer be required to register that boat with the State. You will be required to have a Sandy Pines non-motorized land sticker and display your site number, at least three inches high and highly visible, on the right rear corner of the vessel for identification. The cost of the non-motorizes land stickers for 2014 will be \$12.
