

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PARK RANGER NEWS by Steve Deyarmond

Snow load:

Porch enclosure roofs have become damaged from snow load, in the past. Some trailer roofs have also been damaged by snow load. Please remember to check or have a friend check the amount of snow on your porch enclosure roofs.

Sandy Pines commonly has lake effect snow. As a result the park normally has more snow than inland areas.

The Ranger Station will have phone numbers of persons who clean snow off from roofs. Please contact them for phone numbers and names if you need to have snow shoveled off porch roofs.

Golf cart roof bowing can also occur from the accumulation of snow. Don't forget to check your golf cart roof if stored outside.

Lake Ice:

As the days begin to get colder, ice will form on the lake. Please use great caution when going out on the ice.

A general guideline of four inches of new, clear, ice is the minimum thickness for travel on foot. A general guideline of five inches of ice is required for snowmobiles. Remember, these are general guidelines, and many factors besides thickness determine the safety of the ice. The lake does have a constant current, and underwater springs. These can make the ice weaker in various areas. Don't risk

your life to get out on the lake to fish or snowmobile.

The water is extremely cold, and hypothermia can place your life at risk, should you fall through the ice.

Snowmobile usage of the Park:

Please operate snowmobiles on Park roadways, and abide by the 10mph speed limit and vehicle operation rules.

Operators must have a State driver's license or State issued snowmobile safety certificate.

Please do not cut across member sites or drive in green areas.

If driving along the lake, be careful not to run into a dock or boat stake along the shoreline.

Roadways in the Park are often snow and ice covered. Stopping distances increase. Use caution and slow down when traveling around curves.

Snowmobile trails are nearby Sandy Pines and connect with the Nature Trails in Phase 3. Local Trail Maps are available at area retailers.

Park Roads and winter conditions:

Maintenance does a very good job of plowing the roadways in the winter. However; winter storms and lake effect snow can cause Park roadways to be filled with snow. Expect the roadways within the Park to be snow/ice covered and slippery.

If you decide to come to the Park, be aware of the weather forecast and contact the Ranger Station to check current conditions. Lake effect snow can accumulate quickly, and blowing snow can fill roadways. Maintenance is not in the Park 24 hrs. a day. Park roadways can, and do, fill with snow that impedes travel. If the weather changes, you may want to decide to leave before heavy snow or snow storms, or plan ahead to stay in the Park until roadways are cleared. It can be a few days after severe storms that County roadways or Park roadways are cleared.

Please do not park on the roadways within the Park. This prevents the Park's plow trucks from plowing streets. If you plan to come out to the Park, plan to clear your driveway, park at the nearest convenience center, at the core parking lot, or the Adult Recreation Center parking lot.

Getting to your site, over the plowed snow banks and through the snow, can be very exhausting. If you have health conditions, you may have a difficult time reaching your site.

Plan ahead if you have health conditions that will prevent you from walking distances, or prevent you from shoveling snow. Don't over exert yourself!

Enjoy the winter and stay safe!

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

Adult Craft Class helps Middleman Ministries

The Adult Craft classes worked on a lot of new projects this past season. During the course of the summer, our class learned about a Mission Project from Vicki Avery, one of our Rangers. She talked about Christmas Present Packets that her church sends to a Mission in Mexico, through the Middleman Ministries. The packets were to include an apron for each of the women in a Village that is located right next to a city dump. When Vonn learned of this mission, she brought the idea to class, and our wonderful Sandy Pines people came forward with donations of supplies and their time.

We set a goal to make 200 aprons. We scheduled a Sewing Bee, and some of our members

brought fabric, cut out aprons, and began sewing. By September, there were only a few ladies in our class left at Sandy Pines to help us reach our goal.

On September 23, we presented 187 aprons to the Diamond Springs Wesleyan Church and Rosie Gonzalez, the head of Middleman Ministries. It was a very rewarding night to hear about the village, and to know that our work was going to be appreciated by so many women. There are many other needs for those in the villages in Mexico, and we hope to be able to dedicate some of our classes next summer to fulfilling these needs. A very special thank you to all who gave donations of their time, cutting and sewing the aprons, and also to those who provided fabric, bias tape and money for us to purchase supplies.

Thanks again to everyone for a wonderful year. See you in 2010!

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
A CAPITOL IDEA UPDATE by Jean Richards


