Winterizings: Maintenance will start winterizing trailers after September 17th. No winterizing will be done after November 1st. Get your order in early, we will only take the first 500. No phone orders, a signature is required. The price is \$57.00, if the departure date is prior to October 8th and we have the keys by that date. After October 8th, the cost is \$77.00. All winterizings include a final pumpout.

Flea Markets: The last Flea Market of the year is October 6th. Spaces are \$22.00. You will be able to reserve a space for the 2008 Flea Markets after Labor Day, September 3rd. Dates for the 2008 Flea Markets are: May 3, May 24, June 7, July 5, August 9, September 6 & October 4.

Cable TV: Members who have the internet or a digital box with Charter, will need to turn their equipment into our office and we will let Charter Cable know to disconnect that service.

Effective September 12th, some of the existing cable channels will be assigned new channel numbers. The affected channels and the new channel # will be: ESPN Classic (209 Digital), G4 (76Digital), WE (125 Digital), Turner Classic Movies (40), Univision (52) & Style (68).

Address Changes: Please let the office know if you have a winter address and phone # that we will need to use once you leave the Park for the season.

Wireless Internet: Locations for wireless internet are: the Ranger Station, Core area, Library, CC#3, Golden Onion, Outdoor Pool and the Recreation

Station.

Pumpouts: There are no pumpouts done on Sundays or after 3:00 pm, Monday - Saturday. There is a portable sewage container (blue boy) at the Ranger Station you can use to empty your holding tank, if necessary.

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Hot Tub Update

The Board of Directors has decided not to add a hot tub to the Recreation Station project for the following reasons: Survey responses (535) were not supportive (57% yes, 43% no); hot tub would cost \$65,000, be "T" shaped, and hold only 12-14 persons at a time; concern for possible excessive equipment maintenance; concern for system shut-downs; and frequent testing and monitoring requirements. There is no urgency for a hot tub. If a strong interest arises in the future, the issue will be placed on an official member ballot.

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PARK RANGER NEWS by Steve Deyarmond

Preparing for the fall/winter storage mode:

- 1) Secure and place outdoor items in shelter
- 2) Winterize your trailer prior to freezing temps and have your holding tank pumped before freezing temps
- 3) Remove items that will freeze in cupboards. Remove alcoholic beverages from the park.
- 4) Defrost and clean your refrigerator. Place baking soda in the refrigerator to absorb odors
- 5) Place moth balls under your trailer to deter critters. Place decon or mouse-proofer down to deter mice.
- 6) Place golf carts in storage or affix to a stationary object or your second golf cart with chain and padlock to deter theft. A wheel can also be removed to deter theft. Disconnect batteries.
- 7) Turn off your propane tanks. Have your propane tanks filled if you plan to visit in the winter months. Have a furnace technician check your furnace for proper operation.
- 8) Have your watercraft winterized and place in storage. Outboard motors should be secured with chain and padlock.
- 9) Contact your lawn service for fall leaf removal.
- 10) Close vents, windows, and roll up awnings. Place pop up campers in storage mode. Secure your door from the winter months. Have a technician check around roof vents for proper weather seal.
- 11) Turn off electric at the pedestal at the road.
- 12) Place stabilizer gas treatment in golf carts, lawn mowers, watercraft and mopeds.
- 13) Remove boat dock from the lake. Place boat dock on site. Boat docks may not be stored in the green area. Watercraft may not be stored on the beach or in the green areas.
- 14) Turn off your water at the water riser, disconnect your water line and mark your water line.
- 15) Make sure that Sandy Pines has your winter address and phone number. Update the park if you move in the winter. Leave an emergency contact name with the park if you plan to be out of state or a distance away in the winter months.
- 16) Remember to replace your smoke detector batteries before leaving this fall.
- 17) Remember to turn off your thermostat before leaving this winter.
- 18) Remove valuables and valuable items from your trailer for the winter months.

There will be a "Grand Opening" scheduled in the spring when everything is completed. Additional information about the Grand Opening will be available as plans are formulated.





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

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Unapproved - Aug. 10, 2007 - Board Meeting Minutes

CALL TO ORDER: President, Lee VanHarn called the meeting to order at 7:31 pm.

INVOCATION: Lee VanHarn offered prayer.

ROLL CALL: Lee VanHarn, Mike Young, Tom Aldrich, Jim Schipper, Jean Richards, Stan Robbins, and Harvey Aalderink. Staff present: Max Gibbs

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: July 13, 2007, minutes were approved, as presented,

APPROVAL OF NEW MEMBERS: Motion made by Mike Young, second by Tom Aldrich to approve the New Members (52).

OFFICER REPORTS: President VanHarn reported that the Meet the Candidates forums were a success. Personnel Committee has completed their Administrative appraisal. The Board will meet next week to work on goals and objectives. An Orientation meeting will be scheduled for new Board members.

Tom Aldrich reported for the Finance Committee. They met, reviewed and approved the 2007-08 proposed Budget. Dues for 2007-08 will be increased by Cola (2.3%) \$26/per member. Capital Expenditure approved \$30,000 for a lake/gas marina, on condition of a survey of the membership. Fee structure for camping was updated. Tom Aldrich motioned to approve the 2007-08 Budget with a Cost of Living increase in dues of \$26, seconded by Harvey Aalderink. All Ayes. Motion carried. Tom Aldrich motioned that the interest due from Lake Monterey Golf Course to Sandy Pines be forgiven, and no longer require the Golf Course to pay any interest on the loan from Sandy Pines. Seconded by Jean Richards. All Ayes. Motion carried. Stan Robbins moved that the unsold Sandy Pines sites, from January 1, 2008, through June 30, 2008, be granted a \$5,000 promotional offer, which will take the selling price from \$19,900 to \$14,900. Motion seconded by Jim Schipper. All Ayes. Motion carried. Mike Young moved to have the proceeds from the sale during the promotion go to fence completion. Seconded by Harvey Aalderink. Motion defeated by a 4-3 vote. Yes votes from: Aalderink, Robbins, Young. No votes from: Aldrich, Richards, Schipper, VanHarn.

Jean Richards reported for Member Outreach on the hot tub update/survey. 535 were submitted with 57% voting yes, and 43% voting no. Further research will take place before deciding whether or not to go ahead with a hot tub project. It will be brought to the members as an official vote once the decision is made to move forward.

Harvey Aalderink reported on the upcoming events at Sandy Pines.

Tom Aldrich reported for the Vision 2010 Committee. The Committee met and discussed the possibility of a gas marina on Lake Monterey. There is \$30,000 in the budget for this project. There will be a survey in the upcoming Footprints and Weekend Flyers to determine member interest. Tom Aldrich moved to ban all motorized vehicles from the Phase Three Nature area. Seconded by Mike Young. This would not prohibit snowmobiles or ban handicapped access. After member input, motion was withdrawn by Tom. Additional information will be obtained before acting on this.

Administrative Reports: Max Gibbs, Park Director reported five handicapped accessible picnic tables have been added to the Teepee area and the Outdoor Pavilion. The Halloween program was very successful with over 200 children attending the party. Family Day was a huge success with many families enjoying the day. Special thanks to all of the volunteers who helped to make these events the success that they were. Look for details in the Weekend Flyer regarding the Opening of the Recreation Station.

Old Business - None

New Business - The Annual Board of Directors Election will be held on Saturday, August 18th with polls open from 9 am to 2 pm. The Annual Meetings for Sandy Pines and the Lake Monterey Golf Course will be held on Saturday, August 18th beginning at 9 am at the Chapel. Golf Course meeting will follow the Sandy Pines meeting.

Jim Schipper motioned to change the September Board meeting from September 14th to September 7th. Tom Aldrich seconded the motion. All Ayes. Motion carried.

Member Questions and Comments - President VanHarn addressed and answered member questions.

Meeting adjourned at 9:02 pm.



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PARK NEWS

Vision 2010 committee

The committee proposed a lakefront gas facility to be located in an area adjacent to the boat rental area. There will be an EPA approved 1,000 gallon tank on the site. It will be enclosed and operated by an attendant. The hours will probably be limited to the weekend, and a small additional charge per gallon for gas at this pump will be assessed. Oil will also be available for sale. There will be a dock where you can park your boat while being serviced with gas. Interested members will be given a card

that will fit on your keychain, will automatically activate the gas pump, and charge your Sandy Pines account. There are approximately 1,400 power boats registered, so this is intended to be a convenience to the members.

In addition, there is a lot of gas spillage when you fill your boat in the lake, especially on weekends when there is a lot of wave activity. Using the gas marina will be ecologically prudent. The board approved a \$30,000 capital expenditure in next

year's budget, subject to an unofficial survey of the members. A questionnaire can be found in this issue of the FOOTPRINTS and the weekly bulletin. Please submit your questionnaire to the office. We want your opinion.

The committee proposed a reactivation of the nature trail adjacent to Phase three. The concept is for both a fitness and nature trail for joggers and walkers. We will possibly include exercise stations along the way. We emphasize this is only in the concept stage. The board has discussed the banning of all golf carts in this area in order for nature to recapture the vegetation along the trail. We would like to hear from you regarding your thoughts on this project, so please write or e-mail the Board.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee has approved the 2007/2008 budget. Dues will be increased by \$26/member per the cost of living increase allowed in our bylaws. The preliminary budget was submitted to the members in May. The only changes include minor fee adjustments for camping sites. We added \$20,000 in budget funds to the approximate \$3,000 in recycling income for the ongoing fencing project, plus the addition of \$30,000 for the lakefront gas facility. The budget was submitted to the board for approval.

The committee also recommended a repeat of the Sandy Pines site promotion granting a \$5,000 promotional offer from \$19,900 to \$14,900 from January 1, 2008 thru June 30, 2008.

2008 DUES, CAPITAL, & SPECIAL ASSESSMENT

The total annual membership dues, capital contribution, and special assessments for the 2007/2008 season will be \$1,246.00 and will be on your September statement as follows:

2008 Annual Dues	\$ 949
2008 Annual Capital	<u>172</u>
Total Dues/Capital	1,121
Electric/Blacktop/Recreation Assessment	<u>125</u>
Total 2008	\$1,246

The cost of living increase for the annual dues and capital contribution is 2.3% or \$26.

The tenth year of the special assessment for the electric/blacktop/recreation upgrade is \$125. For all members who paid their electric assessment in advance, your member account will be billed the tenth assessment and then we will credit your account for that amount. **If you have not yet prepaid your assessment and would like to do so, the remaining three years of the assessment would be an additional \$375.00. Please send a note with your check specifying the additional amount is prepayment of the special assessment. Wouldn't it be great if we could pay off the electric/blacktop/recreation loan in full? Think of the interest costs the membership would save. Please, consider prepaying the balance of your electric assessment this year.**

YOU HAVE TWO PAYMENT OPTIONS:

Dues, Capital Contributions, Special Assessments, and all other fees or charges (the total balance billed to your account) Must be paid in full by October 31, 2007 to avoid service charges.

OR

SIX MONTHLY INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS to pay **the dues, capital contributions, and special assessments only** in the amount of \$215.50 due by the 25th of each month (October through March). PLEASE NOTE: **The payment plan includes only the dues, capital contributions, special assessments, and related service charges. The payment plan DOES NOT include any other fees and charges billed to your account each month. You must add all other charges for services, electric, state unit tax, etc. to the monthly installment amount of \$215.50.**

SERVICE CHARGES: A service charge of 1.5% (18% APR) applies after the 25th day of each month on the unpaid balance on your account. We do not accept postmarks or check dates as payment dates, so please mail early. We cannot guarantee timely delivery by the post office. Unfortunately, we cannot waive the service charges. **Your payments on account are due in the office on or before the 25th of the month. Accounts more than 60 days past due will have all magnetic cards deactivated and there will be an additional charge of \$20 per card for reactivation.**

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
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
